February 14, 2021

Last Sunday after the Epiphany

(The Readers will begin the service at the rear of the church with the greeting and exchange with the congregation and then process to the lectern during the hymn.

Reader 1 – Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

People – The Lord is in his Holy Temple, let all the earth keep silence before him.

Reader 1 – Good Morning. The Lord be with you.

Reader 1 – We will read responsively psalm 51

Reader 2 – Open my lips, O Lord

People – and my mouth shall proclaim your praise.

Reader 2 – Create in me a clean heart, O Lord

People – and renew a right spirit within me.

Reader 2 - Cast me not away from your presence

People – and take not your Holy Spirit from me

Reader 2 – Give me the joy of your saving help again

People – and sustain me with your bountiful spirit

Reader -2 Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit

Reader 1 – Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! By his great mercy we have been born anew to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead.

Reader 2 – Lord God, almighty and everlasting Father, you have brought us in safety to this new day: preserve us with your mighty power, that we may not fall into sin, nor be overcome by adversity: and in all we do, direct us to the fulfilling of your purpose, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Reader 1 – O God, you will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are fixed on you; for in returning and rest we shall be saved; in quietness and trust shall be our strength.

Reader 2 – Glory be to the Father, and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit

People – as it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever. Amen.

Reader 1 – Please be seated. Let us read responsively Psalm 121.

1 I lift up my eyes to the hills;*

From where is my help to come?

2 My help comes from the Lord,*

The maker of heaven and earth.

3 He will not let your foot be moved,*

And he who watches over you will not fall asleep.

4 Behold, he who keeps watch over Israel*

Shall neither slumber nor sleep;

5 The Lord himself watches over you;*

The Lord is your shade at your right hand,

6 So that the sun shall not strike you by day,*

Nor the moon by night.

7 The Lord shall preserve you from all evil;*

It is he who shall keep you safe.

8 The Lord shall watch over your going out and

Your coming in,*

From this time forth for evermore.

Confession of Sin

Reader 2 – We have come together in the presence of Almighty God our heavenly Father, to set forth his praise, to hear his holy Word, and to ask for ourselves and on behalf of others, those things that are necessary for our life and our salvation. And so that we may prepare ourselves in heart and mind to worship him, let us kneel in silence, and with penitent and obedient hearts confess our sins, that we may obtain forgiveness by his infinite goodness and mercy.

Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought word and deed, by what we have done and by what we

have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbor as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your name. Amen

Reader 2 – almighty God, have mercy upon us, forgive us all our sins, through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen us in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit, keep us in eternal life. Amen.

Please be seated.

Collect of the Day

Reader 1 – O God, who before the passion of your only-begotten Son revealed his glory upon the holy mountain. Grant to us that we, beholding by faith the light of his countenance, may be strengthened to bear our cross, and be changed into his likeness from glory to glory; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

The Lay Reader assigned to read this day will present the Old Testament lesson, the Psalm and the New testament lesson.

Psalm 50:1-6

1 The Lord, the God of gods, has spoken;*

He has called the earth from the rising of the sun to its setting.

2 Out of Zion, perfect in its beauty,*

God reveals himself in glory.

3 Our God will come and will not keep silence;*

Before him there is a consuming flame,

And round about him a raging storm.

4 He calls the heavens and the earth from above*

To witness the judgment of his people.

5 “Gather before me my loyal followers,*
Those who have made a covenant with me
And sealed it with sacrifice.”
6 Let the heavens declare the rightness of his cause;*
For God himself is judge.

Reader 1 – Please be seated

Our service continues with psalm 95 – The Venite

Reader 1 – Come let us sing to the Lord; let us shout for joy to the Rock of our salvation. Let us come before His presence with thanksgiving, and raise a loud shout to him with psalms.

People – For the Lord is a great God and a great King above all gods. In his hand are the caverns of the earth, and the height of the hills are his also. The sea is his, for he made it, and his hands have molded the dry land.

Reader 1 – Come, let us bow down and bend the knee, and kneel before the Lord our maker. For he is our God, and we are the people of his pasture and the sheep of his hand. Oh that today you should hearken to his voice.

Reader 2 Let us read in unison Psalm 100 – The Jubilate

Be joyful in the Lord, all you lands,
Serve the Lord with gladness,
And come before his presence with a song
Know this: The Lord himself is God;
He himself has med us, and we are his.
We are his people and the sheep of his pasture.
Enter his gates with thanksgiving;
Go into his courts with praise;
Give thanks to him and call upon his name.
For the Lord is good;
His mercy is everlasting,
And his faithfulness endures from age to age.

Reader 1 – A collect for guidance

Heavenly Father, in you we live and move and have our being: We humbly pray you to guide and govern us by your Holy Spirit, that in all our cares and occupations of our life we may not forget you, but may remember that we are ever walking in your sight; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Reader 2 – Of the Reign of Christ

Almighty and everlasting God, whose will it is to restore all things in your well-beloved Son, the King of kings and the Lord of lords: Mercifully grant that the peoples of the earth, divided and enslaved by sin, may be freed and brought together under his most gracious rule; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God now and forever. Amen.

Let us read responsively, Prayer B – alternating lines.

Reader 1 – Save your people Lord, and bless your inheritance;

People – Govern and uphold them, now and always.

Reader 1 – Day by day we bless you;

People – We praise your name forever.

Reader 1 – Lord, Keep us from all sin today;

People – Have mercy on us Lord, have mercy.

Reader 1 – Lord, show us your love and mercy;

People – For we put our trust in you.

Reader 1 – In you Lord is our hope;

People – And we shall never hope in vain.

Reader 2 – Let us all stand as we say together Prayer 20, Glory to God.

Glory to God in the highest and peace to his people on earth. Lord God heavenly King, almighty God and Father. We worship you we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory. Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world; have mercy on us. You are seated at the right hand of the Father; receive our prayer for you alone are the Holy One, you alone

are the Lord. You alone are the most high, Jesus Christ with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Reader 2 – Please remain standing as we profess the things we believe as Christians by saying together, The Apostle’s Creed.

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into the dead. On the third day he rose again, and ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

Reader 2 – The Lay Reader will now offer the Prayers of the People.

And we pray, give us such awareness of your mercies, that with truly thankful hearts we may show forth your praise, not only with our lips, but in our lives, by giving up ourselves to your service and by walking before you in holiness and righteousness all our days; through Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom, with you and the Holy Spirit, be honor and glory throughout all ages. Amen.

Reader 2 – Almighty God, you have given us grace at this time with one accord to make our common supplication to you. And you have

promised through your well beloved Son, that when two or three are gathered together in his Name, you will be in the midst of them: Fulfill now, O Lord, our desires and petitions as may be best for us; granting us in this world, knowledge of your truth, and in the age to come life everlasting.
