**St. Stephen's Continuing Response to the COVID-19 Virus.** We are most thankful that our protocols for worship and use of the Church have been successful. To date, we have no reports of anyone attending church who is contagious. While government promulgate policies regarding indoor gatherings and maximum occupancy ceilings, we are bound to adhere to what our Bishop promulgates. We consistently review our plan and protocols for any needed adjustment. We feel the time has come to <u>prepare</u> for larger numbers of people being able to return to in-person worship. One factor which will impact our decisions are knowing the number of people who have received vaccination.

We will soon be sending out a BLIND survey to determine how many have been vaccinated or plan to be. We understand that the decision on whether or not to become vaccinated is a personal one and we will appreciate your participation in the survey.

## **Update From The Saint Stephen's Food Pantry**

In February 2021, we feed 81 families comprised 275 people. During the entire year of 2020 we feed 764 separate families which was comprised of 1749 adults and 791 children—2540 individual people in need of the assistance our food pantry provides.

# **Spotlighted This Month...** Glenys Baulderstone

When we think about certain members of our congregation, I often wonder if any of us know about their background and what they have accomplished in their lives. We see them in Church each Sunday and know them on a limited basis. A good example of a truly diverse background is Glenys Balderstone. Glenys has such an interesting history that I am glad to share this information so we can learn of all the talents she possesses.

Glenys grew up in Cammeray, which is a Harbourside suburb of Sydney, Australia. After high school she went to work for BP Australia and also went to Business College part time. After her work schedule each evening, she took classes at Sydney's oldest repertory

theater, The Independent Theater. She now uses that training as a lay reader on Sundays at St. Stephen's. She spent four years each Saturday playing the female lead in children's theater plays at the Wayside Theater. The male lead happened to be Ken Baulderstone who was newly arrived from Adelaide. They hit it off and were engaged within three months and married three months after that. They moved to the suburbs and children Adam & Melanie were born. They have recently celebrated their 50<sup>th</sup> Wedding Anniversary.

After returning from a three-month trip around the world in 1977 with their children, Ken went on an overseas assignment with NCR. The position was located in Tehran but because of war going on there, Ken was sent to Dayton Ohio with his family and then Ken went to Tehran for the job assignment alone leaving Glenys and family back in Ohio. In 1981 Ken took an assignment in Kuwait and took the family there of which they stayed for three years. While there, Glenys joined a British theater group, the Kuwait Players. Kuwait is a strict Moslem country, so Glenys and family practiced Christianity in their living room. Once again it was time to move, and the family moved to Tokyo for 24 months with a new assignment for Ken's position at NCR.

Ken & Glenys have three grandchildren and the oldest was christened at St. Stephen's by Father Murray. Glenys has been a devoted volunteer at St. Stephen's and has taught Sunday School, worked at the Thrift Outlet and is a Lay Reader. She has attended our evening Bible Study Group and The Sunday Seminar which hopefully will resume some time in the near future. Glenys also is involved in the Saturday Evening Service in the Chapel Gardens during the warmer months. She also participates in our Sunday Morning Prayer Service when we are not able to have a priest. Currently Glenys serves on our Vestry and the Diocesan Committee. She is also on the Board of Pine Shores Art Association and she artistically paints with fellow artists, from our congregation and finally she is on the Waretown Special Events Committee which will resume meetings soon.

As you can see, there is so much that each of us has to offer and when we have an opportunity to learn the history of our fellow parishioners, we know how much we are blessed to have them be a part of our St. Stephen's community.
