Litany of Naming (by Rev. Alan Johnson)

On this Mental Health Sunday, we join in this Litany of Naming. **As a congregation we are glad to**

lift up our voices and our spirits to break the silence that often happens when we are confronted with mental illness.

As a faith community, we name the gifts and the often unnamed experiences which come to those who live with a mental illness such as major depression, bipolar disorder, anxiety disorder, schizophrenia, substance use, addiction, historic and generational trauma, racial trauma, grief and eating disorder. We name:

The Hope which upholds our spirit through honest sharing;

The Pain when people turn away because of fear;

The Courage to speak in a safe place the way that Jesus spoke truth with love;

L: The Strength from being with others who listen compassionately; The Isolation that comes when no one knows what to say;

The Realization that mental illnesses and brain disorders can be managed;

The Exhaustion that comes with living with a mental illness as well as for those who are caregivers;

The Welcome of mental health as part of our church's ministry and outreach;

The Wisdom that comes when we become educated about mental health; The Spirituality that comes when we walk alongside those who show both resilience and vulnerability in their lives affected by mental illness;

All: We receive these gifts that we have named, those which are welcomed and those that are challenges. We come before you, our God, knowing we are not alone and that You will show us a way to be and live. In the name of Jesus, we pray, Amen.
