"You will see greater things than these."

To be able to see greater things, Nathanael had to move from the fig tree where he had been sitting and follow Jesus.

The call to 'follow'; to 'come and see' comes at different stages in each one's life. Like Samuel, one must be able to hear the voice and respond 'speak for your servant is listening'. The lockdown and covid-19 pandemic has put a strain on our communities, on our families and our well-being. Some people who are finding it hard to make ends meet may not hear the voice; like Samuel they may not recognise the voice at first. God does not give up on us. We are invited to come just as we are.

GOSPEL John 1:43-51. The next day Jesus decided to go to Galilee. He found Philip and said to him, "Follow me." Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter. Philip found Nathanael and said to him, "We have found him about whom Moses in the law and also the prophets wrote, Jesus son of Joseph from Nazareth." Nathanael said to him, "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Philip said to him, "Come and see." When Jesus saw Nathanael coming toward him, he said of him, "Here is truly an Israelite in whom there is no deceit!" Nathanael asked him, "Where did you come to know me?" Jesus answered, "I saw you under the fig tree before Philip called you." Nathanael replied, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!" Jesus answered, "Do you believe because I told you that I saw you under the fig tree? You will see greater things than these." And he said to him, "Very truly, I tell you, you will see heaven opened and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of Man."

THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

Nathanael, also known as Bartholomew, has the distinction of being the first recorded person in the Bible to confess belief in Jesus as the Son of God and Saviour. When Nathanael accepted Jesus' call, he became his disciple. He was a witness to the resurrection and the <u>Ascension</u> of Jesus and became a missionary, spreading the gospel. Philip invited Nathanael to meet Jesus with the words "Come and See".


Who first invited you to 'Come and See' Jesus? Perhaps, as a short prayer, you are able to give thanks to Jesus for the people who first called you to meet him.
