- II. Who was Maria Callas?
 - A. Maria Anna Cecilia Sofia Kalogeropoulos, Dec. 2, 1923-Sept. 16, 1977
 - B. Born in NY City, died in Paris, France
 - C. Studied at the Athens Conservatory
 - D. Parents separated when her mother took Maria and her sister in 1937 to Athens.
 - E. Maria's relationship with her mother was problematic. As Callas herself said in these excerpts from two interview: (Source, Wikipedia, https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Maria_Callas)

"My sister was slim and beautiful and friendly, and my mother always preferred her. I was the ugly duckling, fat and clumsy and unpopular. It is a cruel thing to make a child feel ugly and unwanted... I'll never forgive her for taking my childhood away. During all the years I should have been playing and growing up, I was singing or making money. Everything I did for them was mostly good and everything they did to me was mostly bad."

In 1957, she told Chicago radio host Norman Ross Jr., "There must be a law against forcing children to perform at an early age. Children should have a wonderful childhood. They should not be given too much responsibility."

- F. Married Italian industrialist Giovanni Battista Menegheni in 1949; their marriage ended in 1959; she had begun a relationship with Aristotle Onassis in 1957
- G. Her relationship with Onassis ended in 1968, when Onassis married Jacqueline Kennedy. Callas died in Paris in 1977, isolated and heartbroken that Onassis had rejected her.
