FINANCIAL UPDATE

Offerings received in the third week of July were \$6,230, a combination of offerings received electronically, in the mail, and in the Sunday offering plate. This brings our total offerings for July to \$13,948. To reach our monthly giving "break even target" of \$22,500, we will need \$2,850 weekly for the remainder of July. We continue to run behind on income sufficient to meet 100% of the month's expenses. Recently we have seen a downward trend in giving. Through June, we are \$24,028 behind in overall income compared to expenses.

DEFICIT REDUCTION: AN OPTION FOR SOME?

Sue Weldner updated the congregation on Sunday the 17th about the financial challenge of reducing our deficit. She indicated that we either need to reduce spending and/or increase income. The following Morning Call article (July 18) illustrates a way some members may be able to save on taxes while at the same time increasing donations.

"Q: Is there any way to avoid taxes on the Required Minimum Distribution from my IRA? The amount pushes me into the 22% bracket."

"A: Great News-- You can make a Qualified Charitable Distribution where the money bypasses you and goes straight to charity. Here's how it works. If you are over age 70 1/12 you can grant up to \$100,000 directly to an eligible charity (not a private foundation, a charitable supporting organization or a donor advised fund) from your IRA, without paying tax on the amount of the donation. While you are not entitled to claim a charitable contribution, you won't pay taxes on the money withdrawn and this will keep your highest tax bracket at 12%"

The bottom line: Save on Taxes? Yes. Increase contributions? Yes.

Note: This must be a direct transfer from one's 401k account to the charity.

Taking my faith along to the polls: an Invitation from Rev. Becca Stephens August 3 6:00-8:00 pm

As a member of POWER Lehigh Valley, I see this year's upcoming general election as an opportunity for me to witness to my faith as it relates to our current political climate.

Many think that separation of church and state means that we can't talk about politics in church. As a church we cannot promote a particular candidate because that would violate the terms of our non-profit status, however, we can focus on political policies which impact all of us.

I believe that Jesus was modeling God's kingdom on earth, which we pray for every Sunday. Think about Jesus' ministry. Jesus intentionally reached out to people on the margins. That's what his ministry was all about

As a woman of faith, I am looking at the policies advocated by political candidates. I am looking for candidates who are advocating for people on the margins: People dependent on food banks because their wages are too low, those living without homes, the LGBTQ community. I am looking for candidates who will support the rights of women, who will support the rights of all citizens to have access to the ballot, who will protect our voting rights, rather than restrict them.
