#### HONORING EMMA KUCZEK-REPP

Today in our gathered worship of God, we celebrate Emma's 100<sup>th</sup> birthday this coming Thursday! What a gift she is to St. John's!

Emma Marie Sheetz was born at home in Mount Pleasant, New Jersey, on September 22, 1922. Two younger brothers, Oscar Junior and Marvin (now both deceased), rounded out the family.



Emma walked two miles each way to Frenchtown High School, graduating in 1940. She met her future husband, Robert "Earl" Repp at a dance held at "The Gobbler." A band scheduled to play that night didn't have transportation. Earl's sister, Arlene, asked Earl to drive. He said yes, if she would introduce him to a particular girl. That girl was Emma Sheetz.

Emma and Earl planned to marry on June 27, 1941. They got in the car with Emma's Mom and Dad, and started driving. At 7:00 pm, wherever they were, that's where they would get married. In Norristown PA, they looked up a minister in the phone book, called him, and asked him to marry them. He asked, "When?" They said "Now" and he agreed. With Mom and Dad as witnesses, they were married.

Earl joined the Navy during World War II. In August 1941, Emma became one of the local "Rosie Riveters" taking up what was typically considered a man's job. First, she worked at Phoenix Clothes making uniforms, then at Mack Trucks, painting parts. She and other Lehigh Valley "Rosies" were recognized in 2008 for their war efforts.

In 1960, she started working for Sears, a job she loved and kept for 31 years until she retired in 1991 to care for her husband. While at Sears, her supervisor would write silly poems for her employees. Emma, the poem writer, was born. She wrote poems for special events and special people. In addition to her skills as a poet, she enjoyed baking, crocheting, and playing board games. She was well known for her funny cakes and rice pudding. In her heyday, the lady could yodel!

Emma and Earl had three children, Phyllis in 1947, and twins Bob and Linda in 1949. There are now six grandchildren and ten greatgrandchildren.

Several years after Earl's passing, Emma married Ed Kuczek, adding four stepchildren, four step-grandchildren and seven great step grandchildren to her extended family. Ed passed away in 2014 and Emma moved to Fellowship Community in 2015.

Emma was very active at Dubbs Memorial UCC, her home away from home. It was a difficult time for Emma when Dubbs Memorial came to an end. St. John's UCC Fullerton opened its doors and hearts to Dubbs' parishioners, who have found their new home on Grape Street. Emma loves it here!

Some of Emma's favorite things are: the color red and the hymn, "Just as I Am."

#### FINANCIAL UPDATE

Offerings received in the second week of September were \$2,762, a combination of offerings received electronically, in the mail, and in the Sunday offering plate. This brings our total offerings for September to \$8,170.

To reach our monthly giving "break even target" of \$22,500, we will need \$7,165 for each week remaining in September. We continue to run behind on income sufficient to meet 100% of the month's expenses. Recently we have seen a downward trend in giving. Through August, we are \$24,695 behind in overall income compared to expenses.
