With gratitude for faithful ministry, we are sad to announce the coming resignation of Rev. Dave Quinn as our Visitation Minister effective November 15. Pastor Dave's congregation in Palmerton and the congregation in Danielsville have voted to share his leadership as their pastor, which will be a great blessing for both faith communities. However, this change in his pastoral leadership responsibilities means he will not be able to continue to serve with us at St. John's. We will announce in the coming weeks how we can honor his ministry and express our gratitude to Pastor Dave.

HEALTHCARE MINISTRY - GRIEF SUPPORT

The mission of our Healthcare Ministry is to promote the spiritual and physical well-being of the St. John's congregation. CONFIRMATION CLASS REGISTRATION

FINANCIAL UPDATE

Offerings received in the third week of September were \$5,764, a combination of offerings received electronically, in the mail, and in the Sunday offering plate. This brings our total offerings for September to \$13,990, about \$8,510 short of our monthly target of \$22,500 in offerings, with one week remaining in September. We continue to run behind on income sufficient to meet 100% of the month's expenses and continue to see a downward trend in giving. Through August, we are \$24,695 behind in overall income compared to expenses. Given where we are for September, we can expect to increase that loss this month.
