

All: May God's ancient action be a present presence as we gather.



In the coming weeks, we will announce more detailed plans to honor Pastor Dave Quinn for his ministry with St. John's UCC, Fullerton and express our gratitude.

FINANCIAL UPDATE

Offerings received in the first week of October were \$8,348, a combination of offerings received electronically, in the mail, and in the Sunday offering plate. To reach our monthly giving "break even target" of \$22,500 we will need \$3,538 weekly for the remainder of October. Through September, we have a **deficit of \$31,720** in overall income compared to expenses.

NEIGHBORS IN NEED

The NIN offering supports the UCC's ministries of justice and compassion throughout the US. This year's offering focuses on economic justice with inflation impacting all of our households. Two-thirds of the offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries to fund an array of local and national initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects. One-third of the offering also supports the UCC's Council for American Indian Ministries (CAIM). A special offering continues for the entire month of October.

UKRAINE RELIEF FUND - THE NEED CONTINUES

Your contributions so far have helped with Ukrainian relief by giving to UCC National, Ukrainian Orthodox Church of the USA, Project HOPE, and World Central Kitchen. As long as this crisis continues, we will receive donations by mail, at worship, or by on-line and text giving. For the month of October, any funds received will go to UCC National. Be sure to note that your contribution is for "Ukraine Relief Fund." Special offering envelopes, along with yellow and blue lapel pins showing your support can be found on the table in the lounge area by the sanctuary.

HURRICANE RELIEF

We don't know what may come next with two months remaining in hurricane season. We know that as a people of faith, we can show up through our prayers and giving for our most vulnerable neighbors and journey with them on the long road to recovery. With your support, we can offer healing and resources through solidarity grants that support relief.
