Confident that you will hear, we call upon you with all the names that make you real to us, the names which create an image in our minds and hearts, an image which our souls can understand and touch. #### UKRAINE RELIEF FUND - THE NEED CONTINUES

Help is urgently needed as harsh winter conditions have arrived in Ukraine. With no end in sight to the war and cruel attacks on civilians and healthcare workers continuing, the situation becomes increasingly dire. The long, hard, cold winter creates an alarming new challenge in keeping internally displaced people safe. Nearly a quarter of them don't have safe housing for the winter, including a lack of power, electricity and heat. This could be deadly as temperatures rapidly decline.

Your donations will help undergird an expanding spectrum of services, such as food, shelter, medical care, WASH (water, sanitation, hygiene), spiritual and psychological care, protection and more in Ukraine and in countries where Ukrainians were forced to relocate. For the month of January, contributions will be sent to UCC National to support programs to help with Ukraine's infrastructure and other needs of the Ukrainian people. Be sure to note that your contribution is for "Ukraine Relief Fund." Special offering envelopes, along with yellow and blue lapel pins showing your support can be found on the table in the lounge area. We are happy to report that for the month of November, \$100 was sent to Project HOPE to help with the people's medical needs.
