### **HURRICANE DISASTER RELIEF**

Hurricanes Helene and Milton have caused significant devastation, impacting countless lives and communities. In response to this disaster, The Mission Committee and the Confirmation Class are asking for your support to UCC Disaster Ministries and Church World Service. Along with 3 other churches, we are collecting items for CWS's Emergency Cleanup Buckets. St. John's is responsible for collecting the following specific items which are on display in the lounge area:

1. 5-gallon bucket with resealable lid (if used, please scrub clean). No buckets that held chemicals of any kind. No screw lid.
2. Scrub brush with or without a handle.
3. 6-9 oz. bottle of non-aerosol insect repellent. Pump spray bottles must have protective covers. Packs of 10-20 insect repellent wipes are also acceptable.
4. Two pairs of heavy-duty, waterproof dishwashing gloves. Latex-free, non-surgical. Durable for multiple- use.

Monetary donations are also being accepted with funds going to UCC Disaster Ministries Hurricane Relief. Checks should be payable to St. John's with Hurricane 2024 in memo section.
