One: In that first moment, you spoke, Radiant God, and the light of creation dispelled the thick darkness of chaos.

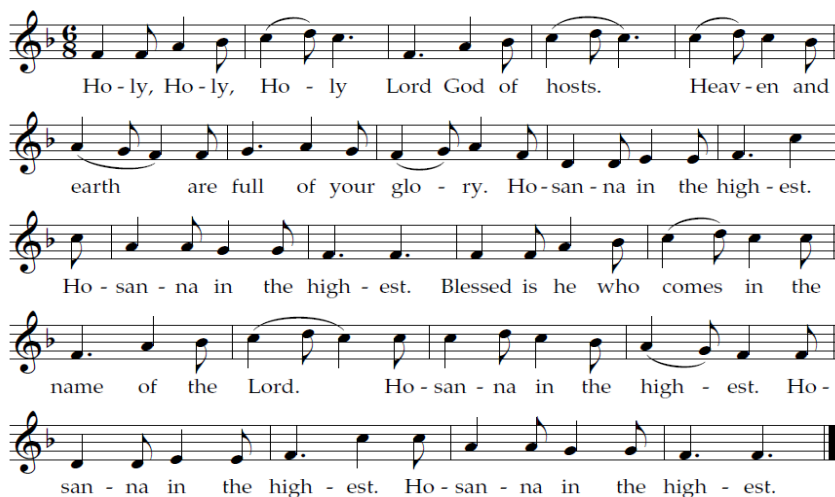
All: **You whispered, and your glory filled the skies. You sang, and the dust of the earth was shaped into your image, as you breathed life into us.**

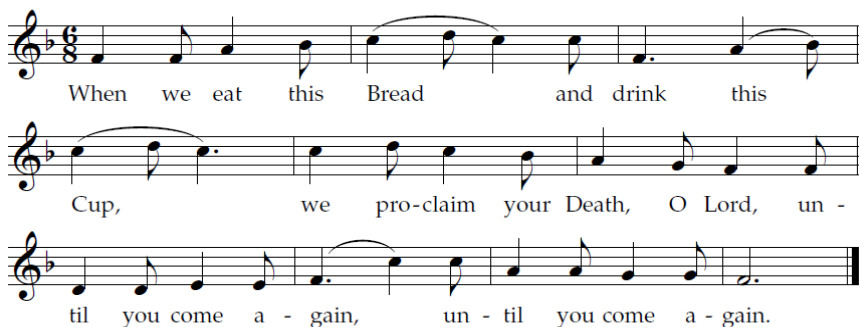

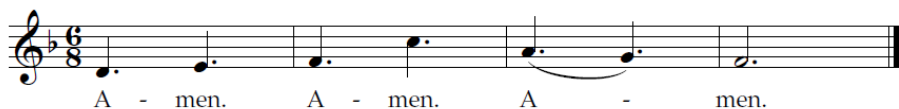
