Consecration of the Elements

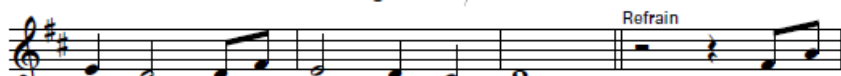

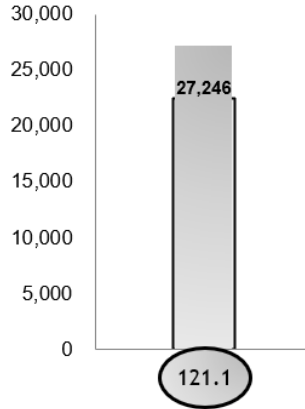

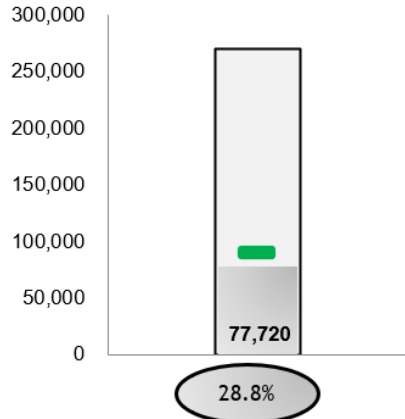
