





- 2. Scrub brush with or without a handle.
- 3. 6-9 oz. bottle of <u>non-aerosol</u> insect repellent. Pump spray bottles must have protective covers. Packs of 10-20 insect repellent wipes are also acceptable.
- 4. Two pairs of heavy-duty, waterproof dishwashing gloves. Latex-free, non-surgical. Durable for multiple- use.

Monetary donations are also being accepted with funds going to UCC Disaster Ministries Hurricane Relief. Checks should be payable to St. John's with Hurricane 2024 in memo section.
