URGENT FINANCIAL UPDATE

Our financial circumstances continue to raise a serious and growing concern for the people of St. John's to act and respond in generosity. There are many in our congregation who for various reasons over the last two years have stopped contributing or who significantly undersupport the church ministry. The Stewardship & Finance Committee asks for EVERY PERSON to prayerfully consider what you can do to promote regular, sustained support.

Offerings received in the first week of July were \$5,114, a combination of offerings received electronically, in the mail, and in the Sunday offering plate. To reach our monthly giving "break even target" of \$22,500, we will need

\$4,345 weekly for the remainder of July. We continue to run behind on income sufficient to meet 100% of the month's expenses. Recently we have seen a downward trend in giving. Through June, we are \$24,028 behind in overall income compared to expenses.

Please do whatever you can to help us increase our weekly contributions and avoid serious negative possibilities that would undermine our efforts to sustain and expand our ministry future! Your faithfulness and generosity are greatly appreciated!

Taking my faith along to the polls:

an Invitation from Rev. Becca Stephens

As a member of POWER Lehigh Valley, I see this year's upcoming general election as an opportunity for me to witness to my faith as it relates to our current political climate. Many think that separation of church and state means that we can't talk about politics in church, and as a church we cannot promote a particular candidate because that would violate the terms of our non-profit status. However, we can focus on political policies which impact all of us.

I believe that Jesus was modeling God's kingdom on earth, which we pray for every Sunday. Think about Jesus' ministry. Jesus intentionally reached out to people on the margins. That's what his ministry was all about.

As a woman of faith, I am looking at the policies advocated by political candidates. I am looking for candidates who are advocating for people on the margins: People dependent on food banks because their wages are too low, those living without homes, the LGBTQ community. I am looking for candidates who will support the rights of women, who will support the rights of all citizens to have access to the ballot, who will protect our voting rights, rather than restrict them. That's how I am looking at this year's election.
