A More Perfect Union



I am the product of a good education in civics, history and community engagement. Even as a young person, my family modeled before me the importance each one of us can make in changing the world around us for the better. The concern was not always for ourselves, but for those whose voices were undervalued and often silenced by the powerful and those who let their money take priority over their good conscience. Voting was not optional. I would register and I would vote.

As I grew older, my ideology shifted over time. While always considering myself to be a fiscally responsible person, "thrifty" as my Grannie might have said, it was my Grandma Horner whose life example most significantly persuaded me to be a well informed voter. For decades, she volunteered with the League of Women Voters to be a resource for people and let them know where they could vote, get non-partisan information about candidates and issues, and know how to register to vote. Grandma would receive calls for weeks in her living room, and most especially on election day. It was her contribution to our American democracy. Voting matters to me because of her.

As the years went by, I felt more and more compelled to take an active role in advocating for specific causes, especially related to education and housing.

Concern for elder care and the cost of health care for women that still today is often more costly than for men. I found that many causes that seemed like "common sense" issues were often hotly contested, rather than reasonably debated and negotiated. We became the other's enemy, rather than citizens with different viewpoints looking for common ground.

While I know the phrase has probably been said about many elections, this year seems once again to be a watershed moment for our country, and the world around us watched and tries to influence us as well. And if I'm completely transparent, I have a particular hope in this election, as do many of you. However, it might not be what you think. Yes, I have a candidate and party of choice and I've cast my vote, as have many of you, so this message will probably not change your viewpoint about who you might vote for. I do hope, however, that I might have some influence as you consider WHAT your vote creates for you next.

Senator Rev. Raphael Warnock, Sr. Pastor of Ebenezer Baptist Church in Atlanta, Georgia, the church the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. once pastored, has called people to consider their votes as a kind of prayer for the kind of world we want to live in and create together. It has caused me to think about what my vote, our votes, might cause us to do on November 6 and all the days after, regardless of who the American people elect as our next President and Vice President, and all the other national, state and local leaders.



What kind of community are we committed to creating with our fellow congregation members, neighbors and family members? What kind of housing is okay for you, but not good enough for me? What kind of healthcare should every person be able to afford? Where

should we be able to enjoy life's great moments without fear of it being our final moment because of gun violence? Who should get to tell another human being, male or female, what they can and cannot do regarding their own bodies and health? I could go on... but you get the idea. The question for me is how will my faith in Jesus, how will my love for God, move me to work more intensely with those who agree with me and those who do not in order to find ways to improve all our lives? How will my faith move me to be in relationship with others to create a better world?

I urge you, as we conclude our 40 Days of Prayer emphasis, during this month, on Election Day, and every day after, consider how we might come together with people from ALL walks of life to be the people of Jesus and share the love of God as best we are able to every person. May our votes and our every word and action be rooted in the love and grace of our gracious, still speaking, still creating God. May we choose to love God, love our neighbors and love ourselves.We are St. John's UCC, Fullerton, and...

"We Worship, We Love and We Serve ~ No Matter What!"


Confirmation Class for 7th & 8th Graders - Affirming Faith through Confirmation Class held in the third-floor Youth Room.

St. John's Kitchen Corner



Welcome back to the very busy St. John's kitchen. Follow me to the kitchen's upper cabinets. All of the cabinets are pretty-well marked. A more specified list of what's inside can be found hanging on the side of the red metal cabinet. There are many things in these cabinets that we rarely use at this time. There is an abundance of Corelle dishes, glass sconces, glass creamers and sugar holders on the upper shelves. The

cabinet closest to the coffee makers has plastic water pitchers in it. The bottom shelf of these upper cabinets has kitchen staples and spices. The staples include things like sugar, flour, salt, pepper and more. These can be used for baking or seasoning any foods that might be served at our gatherings.

The lower cabinets are also well marked and hold items like serving platters and plates, baskets, punch bowls and serving implements. The cabinets over the sinks hold items less used like thermal pitchers for hot drinks and other glass serving type dishes.

Let's finish our tour today with the kitchen drawers - once again labeled for your convenience! The top end drawer near the pantry holds paper, pens, tape, scissors and more. The larger drawers below hold measuring items, pot holders, towels & washcloths and aprons. Going toward the kitchen window you will find odds and ends kitchen implements followed by the knife drawer, the forks and serving spoons drawer, the tongs & spatula drawer, the ice cream scoop drawer, the SAFETY KIT drawer and lastly, the coffee filter drawer. This ends today's tour.

Convenience Costs

Using Your Credit / Debit Cards for Your Support

In recent months, the Stewardship and Finance Committee has been looking for ways to make paying for activities, fundraising and events more convenient for those who want to pay using their credit or debit cards. We've learned that these conveniences come with some cost and we want to be sure all are aware. Here's what we need to know and how we all can help.

First, if you use your credit/debit card for transactions, they are encrypted and secure.

Second, please help us cover the costs assessed to St. John's for each transaction.

When using a card for transactions with us, please be aware that there is a \$0.45



transaction fee plus a $2.85\,\%$ processing fee that we pay for most major credit cards. American Express has a \$0.45 transaction fee plus a $3.5\,\%$ processing fee.

St. John's cannot provide for the convenience without passing along the processing fee. Previously, we had been covering the transaction fee. We now need to extend that convenience cost as well. So, please opt to add the \$0.45 transaction fee to your total and pay the processing fee.

We hope the ability to use a credit/debit card is a convenience and benefit you will enjoy and make good use of in your support of the ministries of St. John's UCC.

Cleanup Bucket List

Hurricanes, floods and other disasters are happening more frequently. When our neighbors around the world experience these unforeseen circumstances, you can make the road to recovery easier with CWS Cleanup Buckets. These buckets are full of essential home recovery supplies that are needed after a disaster strikes.

Supplies Needed:

- One 5-gallon bucket with resealable lid (If reused, please scrub clean. Do not use a bucket that has held chemicals of any kind. No screw lid. Advertisement on the outside acceptable.)
- One 4-8 oz pump spray air freshener
- Five scouring pads (No stainless steel or pads with soap in them. Remove from packaging.)
- · Seven sponges, including one large
- One scrub brush (With or without handle.)
- 18 reusable, lightweight multipurpose dry cleaning towels (No terrycloth, microfiber or paper towels. Remove from packaging.)
- One 32-64 oz or two 25 oz bottle(s) of liquid laundry detergent
- One 16-34 oz bottle of liquid disinfectant dish soap
- One 12-40 oz bottle of liquid concentrate household cleaner that can be mixed with water (No spray bottles.)
- One package of 36-50 clothespins
- One 50-100 ft clothesline (Cotton or plastic line.)
- Five dust masks (N95 particulate respirator dust masks preferred; No surgical masks.)
- Two pairs of heavy-duty, waterproof dishwashing gloves (Latex-free, non-surgical. Durable for multiple-use. Remove from packaging.)
- One pair of work gloves (Cotton with leather palm or all leather.)
- 20-28 heavy duty or contractor type 30-45-gallon trash bags on a roll (Remove from packaging.)
- One 6-9 oz bottle of non-aerosol insect repellent (Pump spray bottles must have protective covers. Packs of 10-20 insect repellent wipes also acceptable.)

All cleaning items must be new and all liquid items must be capped and securely tightened. Place all items into the bucket, making sure they are packed securely to avoid damage during shipment.

Snap the lid on tight and seal with packing tape.
