Renewal of Vows


On November 10th at the Fullerton Fire Company **Linda and Tom Germuga** renewed their wedding vows after 50 years of marriage!

December Worship Services 8:15 + 10:45AM Services Advent Theme: Symbols of the Season




Live Nativity at St. John's UCC, Fullerton



A resolution was on the table about a new conference to be formed with Pennsylvania Southeast Conference among other agenda items. PNEC voted Yes to moving forward with the new conference process. On November 10, the Pennsylvania Southeast Conference voted No to the one conference resolution.

St. John's UCC, Fullerton was honored as one of the PNEC "Five for Five" congregations. That means that we participate in giving to the five UCC yearly mission requests. St. John's staff was featured in a video about our OCWM giving and why we think OCWM is important. You can see the video on our website.

St. John's was also featured as one of six "Open & Accepting" congregations. This is a status we obtain in 2018. Our delegates were Pastors Becky Beckwith and Michelle Funk. Lay delegates are Kim Hillegass and Sharon Czekner.

PNEC News!

Monday, November 12, 2018

Dear Friends,

For many people in our conference, we have spent the last number of years developing relationships with our southern neighbors in Pennsylvania Southeast. We began to develop relationships through invitations to meetings, events, and educational opportunities such as annual meetings, clergy convocation, ministry days, and more. In 2016, we began a formal discernment process by approving a transition team to help us discern whether we were being led into a merger process. For the past two years (2017-2018), the Joint Conference Visioning and Development Team has been charged with discerning God's vision and

calling for the churches of Eastern Pennsylvania. Team members from the north and south worked faithfully in this discernment process. The JCVDT held team meetings, interviewed staff, planned a joint retreat for the PNEC Board and PSEC Consistory, held a workshop for Committees on Ministry, and more. Together, we believed God was leading our Conferences to develop something new, a new way of living into ministry and relationships as a Conference of the United Church of Christ.



On Saturday, November 3rd, our conference voted by an overwhelming majority to move forward in the process of developing this new vision. This was the next step in the discernment process.

On Saturday, November 10th, the PSEC voted against the motion. There was a majority in favor of moving ahead. However, the body was divided, and there was not a 2/3 majority to move ahead in our work.

At this time, we will continue to discern where God is leading us. We have done incredible work together as a conference over the past three years. We have developed new structures to encourage new ministries. Our Committee on Ministry has restructured to be more creative and accountable in its work. We have revised our Constitution and Bylaws to help us become more nimble in our governance. We have a new vitality team to help connect and support our local churches. All of this work has been done through the presence of the Spirit encouraging us and strengthening us as the Body of Christ. Together, in relationship with God and one another, we are experiencing a renewal of the Spirit!

The Conference Board will continue to cast a vision for us in the Penn Northeast Conference to be bold and courageous in following God's call. We will be compassionate and caring in supporting the work of our local churches and pastors. In all things, we will be led by the Spirit to discover what God is calling us to next.

No More Holy Communion Cards? Now It's A Holy Communion Sign-In Book!

What is with the Communion Cards? The question gets asked. Why do we use them since they fall out of our bulletins? They frequently are not filled out by our members. The cards are costly and our local vender is no longer in business. So, what is with the cards anyway?

The communion cards are meant as a way to keep track of who takes Holy Communion and how often. Cards are filled out and put into alphabetical order and then entered into our data base. It is a time consuming and messy process. At the recommendation of the Worship & Music Committee and the Spiritual Council, we have decided to do away with the cards.

Since our Constitution and Bylaws speaks of membership taking communion on a regular basis, we do need to replace the cards with something else. We decided on a Holy Communion Book The book will be in the rear of the sanctuary. You are asked to sign it if you participated in the sacrament. You need only sign it one time per year. The book will be alphabetical according to your last name.

The end of the Holy Communion cards means cost and environmental savings. Please participate often in the sacrament and make sure you sign the book at least one time during 2019. We begin January 6th.

December 2018/January 2019 Music Notes

Advent will focus on symbols. First Sunday is **trumpet**. Austin Sommer will play trumpet at both services and you will hear the trumpet sound from the organ. The trumpet will announce the start of the Advent season.

The Second Sunday in Advent the symbol is **stars.** We will sing "Creator of the Stars of Night". This is a 9th century Latin hymn and did not appear in hymn books until 1875.

Bells is the third symbol. The Handbell Choir will play on the Third Sunday in Advent and also accompany a Christmas carol.

We end the Fourth Sunday in Advent with **manger.** One of the most beloved Christmas carols is "Away in a Manger", which we will sing that Sunday. The Kidz JAM Christmas Pageant will be presented at the 10:45 am service.

The Children's Choir plus soloists will be part of the 6:00 pm Christmas Eve Service. The 9:00 service will have the Handbell, Jubilation, and Chancel Choirs, as well as additional soloists.

Epiphany is January 6th and the Chancel Choir will sing about the wise men and the treasures they brought to Jesus.

The Baptism of Jesus will be celebrated with the Jubilation Choir singing "You Are Mine", by David Haas. This hymn has quickly risen to the top as one of the most important hymn contributions of the last decade. The scripturally rich words, sung in the first person as though by God, are filled with hope and assurance making this useful for baptism.

Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany offer us rich symbolism. May the light of Christ shine on you.

December is Safe Toys and Gifts Month

According to the US Consumer Product Safety Commission, in 2016, there were an estimated 240,000 toy-related injuries treated in US hospital emergency rooms. 73% were to people less than 15 years of age. There were also seven deaths of children under 12 from toys. Additionally, in 2007 alone, toy makers recalled over 19 million toys worldwide because of safety concerns such as lead paint and small magnets.

When it comes to toys and gifts, the excitement and desire to get your children their favorite toys may cause shoppers to forget about safety factors associated with them. Before you make these purchases, it is critical to remember to consider the safety and age range of the toys.

Prevent Blindness America has declared December as Safe Toys and Gifts Awareness Month. The group encourages everyone to consider if the toys they wish to give suits the age and individual skills and abilities of the individual child who will receive it, *especially for infants and children under age three*.

Here are some tips.

1. Inspect all toys before purchasing. Avoid those that shoot or include parts that fly off. The toy should have no sharp edges or points and should be sturdy enough to withstand impact without breaking, being crushed, or being pulled apart easily.

2. When purchasing *toys for children with special needs* try to choose toys that may appeal to different senses such as sound, movement, and texture.

3. Be diligent about inspecting toys your child has received. Check them for age, skill level, and developmental appropriateness. Avoid toys with small parts in young children to prevent choking.

4. Gifts of sports equipment should always be accompanied by protective gear (give a helmet with the skateboard).

5. Avoid toys with lead paint, ropes and cords, or heating elements.
