The Journey Continues

The season of Easter concludes June 1. Our hearts are filled with gratitude and joy as we celebrate the Confirmation of three of our young people at St. John's. These youth have spent months preparing - studying Scripture, asking meaningful questions, praying together, learning about themselves and their faith, and what it means to say "yes" to the promises of faith made on their behalf at baptism. Now, with courage and conviction, they come to stand before the congregation and claim those promises as their own.



In these sacred moments, let us be clear: Confirmation is not a graduation. It's not an end, not a goodbye, and certainly not a moment to close the book, check the spiritual box and say, "Well, that's done." Rather, this is the turning of a sacred page - an invitation to deeper discipleship, to a life more fully lived in the rhythm of Christ's love

In Confirmation, these young people, Aiden Hannis, Nicholas Santee and Lucas Williams are affirming that they want to walk this path of faith with intention. They are saying, "I want to be a part of this church. I want to follow Jesus. I want to keep learning and growing. I want to Worship, Love and Serve... No Matter What!" What a powerful thing to witness - and what a sacred responsibility for us, their church family.

So what comes next?

First, we continue to show up for them. We keep inviting them - not just to youth activities, but to worship leadership, to service projects, to conversations that matter. We ask their opinions. We listen. We remember that faith is not about having all the answers, but about having a safe space to ask the questions with each other.

Next, we remember that community doesn't have an age limit. These young people are not "the future of the church" - they are the church, right now, fully part of our faith family. Their voices, their gifts, their presence belong here, just as much as anyone else's.

And finally, we walk alongside them. Like all of us, their spiritual journeys will be full of twists and turns. There will be seasons of deep connection and seasons of doubt. Our calling is not to have a perfect roadmap for them, but to be faithful companions - reminding them that we and God are with them every step of the way.

To our Confirmands: we are so proud of you. Your "yes" is courageous. Your faith is inspiring. Your questions are holy. We are honored to be part of this journey with you - not as people who are sending you off, but as people who are walking right beside you, welcoming you in to an open and affirming faith.

Together, let us be those who love, in grace and hope. We are St. John's UCC, Fullerton, and...

"We Worship, We Love and We Serve ~ No Matter What!"

God Is Giving Us an Opportunity



For the last two and a half years, our Personnel Committee, our Elders and Consistory leadership and Sr. Pastor have been committed to growing our ministry and restoring our program staff to support our outreach, first to children and youth, then to pastoral care support. The last few years have been challenging, refocusing our ministry and adjusting to the financial realities post-COVID and with pastoral and several staff position reductions. This has been challenging work.

In April, Rev. Dr. Bonnie Bates, our PNEC Conference Minister, invited St. John's to consider an opportunity to build a relationship and grow our ministry with Children and Youth, in Pastoral Care and Worship. A young woman who is a Member in Discernment, working to complete seminary at Moravian University and further explore her calling to ministry, is looking for a congregation where she can complete her Field Education Placement and further discern how God would have her serve in ministry. The Elders of our Spiritual Council, the Consistory leadership and the Sr. Pastor have all visited with Samantha Kistler and believe God is opening a tremendous opportunity for us to grow our ministry and help Samantha discern her calling.

What would be involved? St. John's would provide a stipend to support Samantha's travel and honor her work with us. The initial year of her field placement would begin in August 2025 through May 2026 when Samantha would complete her seminary education and be eligible for ordination.

Samantha would be required to spend 8-10 hours per week in various areas of ministry at St. John's. Her experience with Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) at Phoebe Homes gave her a great appreciation for Pastoral Care and Chaplaincy. Samantha is also passionate about creating enriching experiences in Faith Formation for children and youth. Additionally, she has been supporting smaller

congregations with pulpit supply while other pastors are on vacation and providing some interim worship leadership.

We would provide a ministry support loop in addition to pastoral supervision, to help Samantha have the best ministry experience and growth possible in her discernment.

All these areas would be part of her continuing Field Education placement at St. John's if we approve this partnership in ministry. The Stewardship and Finance Committee and Sr. Pastor are exploring more detailed descriptions of what a second year of ministry partnership might look like should Samantha commit to remaining in bi-vocational ministry while continuing her current full time employment as an Emotional Support Teacher for the Lehighton High School. This would enable her to continue to have other employment benefits such as healthcare, which we currently cannot provide.

The Elders and Consistory also believe it is in the best interest of St. John's, in our ministry with families and our homebound, to have a commitment to a minimum of two years of partnered ministry. We don't believe it is fair to our congregation or to Samantha to have only one year of beginning to restore ministry leadership and not invest in each other to build something more substantial.

The Stewardship and Finance Committee and Sr. Pastor, with the encouragement of the Consistory, are looking at utilizing some of our currently self-restricted funds to provide the needed support for the second year. We believe with the generous support of two anticipated funding sources, and the ongoing support of the St. John's family, we can do this work. We believe God is calling us to use funds to invest in growing our program ministry and pastoral support as well as investing in the start of a person's ministry career.

The St. John's leadership believes God is calling us to something challenging and new. We invite your prayerful consideration and your continuing financial support to bring this opportunity into reality. The Stewardship and Finance Committee will make their support recommendations to the Consistory for their meeting on June 10. 

"You shall receive power!" These words of Jesus to his disciples, and to all of us today, were first experienced by the disciples and over 3,000 people on the Day of Pentecost. The Feast of Pentecost, celebrated 50 days after Easter, commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and those who heard them and believed their message, marking the birth of the Church. It's also a reminder of the gift of the Holy Spirit and the beginning of the Church's mission to spread the Good News!

The name "Pentecost" comes from the Greek word for "fifty," referring to the 50th day after Passover in the Jewish calendar. It was originally known as Shavuot, or the Feast of Weeks, a harvest festival. In Jewish tradition, this celebration marks the anniversary of the giving of the Ten Commandments to Moses on Mount Sinai.

In our Christian celebration, Pentecost celebrates the fulfillment of Jesus' promise to send the Holy Spirit, described in the Book of Acts. The Holy Spirit empowers believers to proclaim the Gospel and witness to Jesus's life, death, and resurrection. Pentecost is seen as the moment the Church was established as a visible, empowered community, capable of sharing the Gospel with the world.

To be SEEN holds significance, especially in the LGBTQIA+ community, where increasingly, political efforts and legislation is created in states and nations seeking to erase those from our cultural tapestry of inclusion. Pentecost saw God's Spirit come to those who were both Jewish and Gentiles (non-Jewish persons) to share the inclusive embrace of God.

Tax-Advantaged Contributions

Plan Ahead: Tax-Advantaged Giving Opportunities for 2025

Now that the 2024 tax filing season has passed, it's a great time to start planning for 2025—especially if charitable giving is part of your financial picture.

As you may know, the Legacy Tree in the church parlor provides a meaningful way to honor or remember someone special. Donations toward the purchase of a leaf are deposited into our Endowment Accounts, which help supplement St. John's income and support our ministries for years to come.

If you have a 401(k) or IRA and are required to take a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD), you may be able to reduce your federal tax liability by making a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). When done correctly, a direct gift from your retirement account to St. John's or another qualified 501(c) (3) charity counts toward your RMD—but is excluded from taxable income.

For example, someone in a 20% tax bracket who donates \$1,000 directly from their account could save \$200 in taxes. In effect, the charity receives the full amount, but the donor's out-of-pocket cost is reduced.



But what if you don't have an RMD or retirement plan to draw from? There's another option. If you hold stocks or mutual funds that have grown in value, you can donate those appreciated securities directly to the church instead of selling them. This not only supports a worthy cause—it helps you avoid paying capital gains tax.

Let's say you bought stock for \$1,000 and it's now worth \$5,000. Selling it would trigger a \$4,000 capital gain and a potential \$600 tax bill (assuming a 15% capital gains rate). But if you transfer the security directly to St. John's, you can give the full value and bypass the tax entirely.

Every financial situation is unique, and tax laws are complex, so it's always wise to consult your tax or financial advisor before taking action. But with a little planning, your generosity can go further—both for you and for the church.


