Choosing Faith

Is faith a gift or a choice? Is it something God does in us, or something we do for God? The answer, of course, is "Yes." Faith is both a gift freely given and a choice faithfully made. It is God's work within us, but it is also our daily decision to trust God's presence and promises—especially when life is difficult.

When Joshua faced the daunting task of leading God's people into an unknown future after Moses' death, he surely felt uncertain and afraid. In that moment, God spoke words that still echo to us today: "Be strong and courageous; do not be frightened or dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go." (Joshua 1:9). Joshua's story reminds us that choosing faith is not about having everything figured out, but about trusting that God is with us as we take the next step.

Challenges come to all of us: uncertainty about the future, struggles in our families, illness, grief, or the daily weight of responsibilities. In those moments, faith is not simply a belief we hold in our heads; it is a way of living. It is a partnership with God, where we lean on divine strength and open ourselves to be guided, shaped, and sustained.

To choose faith in times of challenge means we resist the pull of fear or despair and instead root ourselves in the hope God provides. In this season of worship, we invite you to consider: What does it mean for us to be people of faith in our own times of challenge? Together, let us be a community that chooses faith — faith that grounds us, strengthens us, and blesses the world around us. We are St. John's UCC, Fullerton, and...

A Word from the Music Ministry

Keeping the Ministry in Music Ministry By Paul Detterman

Most people think church musicians, let alone the Director of Music, are volunteers to create music for the church. Our actual calling, however, is to help other people create the church's music. Whether you're the only musician in a small congregation or the principal professional responsible for a large and diverse ministry, music "ministry" is all about using the gifts God has given us to discover and nurture the gifts God has given others.

A music ministry allows us to be invested in our people, starting with the congregation as a whole. How can we nuture more enthusiastic singing? How can we make hymns and the service more meaningful? How can we draw out their music gifts and expand their repertoire?

Music ministry requires us to be constantly on the lookout for people who have gifts and interest in music, especially children and youth, and to make room for them to discover the joy of sharing their gifts.

A music ministry asks us to respond with grace and humility when—not if—those who are first sharing their gifts might fall a little short of the congregations' expectations, or our own—and it allows us to develop healthy gospel-shaped personal humility as we realize the joy of growing with the people around us, all the while cultivating an atmosphere of grace and gratitude.

At the end of the day, the reason we sing is not perfection. We sing because the world is noisy with grief and greed, and somebody's got to fling beauty back into it. We sing because joy needs witnesses. Voices stitched together can become something larger than ourselves. Sometimes, the only way to remind the world and our weary selves that joy still exists, we only have to sing it into being.


"I have fought the good fight; I have finished the race; I have kept the faith.

Honoring Tradition, Embracing the Future: Worship and Rejoice



St. John's Music Ministry is proud to introduce: The Worship and Rejoice Hymnal.

Worship and Rejoice, a hymnal published by Hope Publishing in 2003, is an extensive collection of 749 titles containing all the essential traditional hymns, plus over 100 of the top contemporary worship songs. The broad scope of Worship & Rejoice makes it the richest resource available for blending different styles of music together in one service.

As we take this next step in growing our worship experience, we would like to introduce this hymnal for usage taking the place of New Century. We are providing you, our faithful members of the congregation, with an opportunity to dedicate each new hymnal purchased. Each hard cover book is valued at \$20.00. Your generosity and commitment is vital to serving others through our beautiful services.

How this benefits St. John's:

Believe it or not, the Worship and Rejoice hymnal has been in use at St John's since its publication in 2003. Prior to Patrick's arrival, our previous music director used this hymnal regularly; making copies of hymns not found in The New Century Hymnal, and publishing them in our weekly bulletin. This is why you will notice the copyright information is published every week in our bulletin.

Is this a needed investment?

While these hymnals open new possibilities for Sunday worship, one of the main reasons New Century was not used as often is the extent of the wording changes made to beloved hymns in pursuit of inclusive language.

A prime example is the Christmas Carol, O Come All Ye Faithful. In the New Century hymnal, the text is the following:

1. O come, all ye faithful, joyful and triumphant, O come now, O come now to Bethlehem. Come and behold the ruler of all angels;

Refrain: O come in adoration, O come in adoration, O come in adoration: Christ is Lord!

Another example of the inclusive language is America the Beautiful—in New Century they changed the title to be O Beautiful for Spacious Skies and the language to the entire first verse.

Example: How beautiful, our spacious skies, our amber waves of grain; our purple mountains as they rise above the fruitful plain. America! America! God's gracious gifts abound, and more and more we're grateful for life's bounty all around.

As you can see, there were significant changes to what we love to sing on Christmas Eve and in general. Worship and Rejoice offers familiar, traditional language for the hymns we all know, plus makes room for new tunes and lyrics.

Help us make a joyful noise to the Lord through our hymns as we take this next step in growth!



Welcome CLIU #21 Work-Based Learning Students!



Neighbors in Need

"Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ." ~ Galatians 6:2

This scripture, from Paul's letter to the Galatians, highlights a dynamic many of us face when we help others or receive help. There's a difference between helping someone and taking over for them. It can be both challenging and a source of comfort to receive care. Giving and receiving is an integral part of justice ministries. Our churches share compassion by not only providing for the basic needs of our neighbors but also asking deeper questions about why these inequalities exist in the first place. When the UCC gathers to collect the Neighbors in Need offering, it works to honor this complexity.

Two-thirds of the offering is used by UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries to provide grants to UCC churches and organizations as well as supporting a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects. One-third of the offering supports the Council

for American Indian Ministry (CAIM). It has been witnessing to Native values and culture as a vital part of the UCC since 1971.

Enclosed with this newsletter is a special offering envelope and insert. The NIN offering will be received at worship on Sunday, October 5, and continue to the end of October.
