Finding Faith in a World of **Doubt**

As we journey forward in Lent and look with greater joy to celebrate Easter, the heart of our faith comes into focus: the triumph of love over fear, life over death, and hope over despair. The resurrection of Christ is more than a historical event; it's an invitation — an invitation to become people of grace, compassion, and transformation. Easter reminds us that faith is not just about believing the right things, but about becoming the right kind of people.

A faith rooted in the resurrection should make us better human beings — more patient, more forgiving, more generous. It should help us see the divine image in every person we meet. It should soften our hearts toward those who suffer and strengthen our resolve to pursue justice and mercy. If our faith doesn't lead us to love more deeply, then perhaps it's time to ask if we're truly following the way of Christ.

But Easter reminds us that love always has the final word.

This Easter, let's embrace a faith that brings life — not just to us, but through us. Let's be people of resurrection, bearing hope in a world that so desperately needs it. Let's be the kind of people who offer grace when it's hard, forgiveness when it's undeserved, and compassion without condition. May the power of Christ's love shape us into better neighbors, friends, and human beings. He is risen — may we rise, too. We are those who love, in grace and hope. FAITH FORMATION SCHEDULE

and Worship Celebrations! Sunday Mornings for Children, Youth & Adults

Welcome to the growing and expectant faith we share together at St. John's! Here's what we have to look forward to as we engage in faith formation and worship together.

8:30am Adult Faith Formation - The Friendship Sunday School Class meets in Room 201, to accommodate those with physical mobility needs. All are welcome to topical studies, biblical reflection and group discussion, led by various class members. Anyone needing assistance, please use the Grape Street elevator entrance and come to the sanctuary level. There's always great conversation and some tasty treats to start your Sunday morning well! Contact Tom and Emilie Moyer for more information.

9:30am Children's Faith Formation - Children gather with the congregation in worship through the Children's message, then are led to Room 101 and our "mini theater" room for the weekly topic lesson. "HOLY MOLY" is our curriculum theme this year! We believe our children are blessings, and we want them to grow in our love and the love of God. The children's table is set up in the Parlor for activity if desired for those who choose to remain during worship with parent supervision for any children not participating in regular faith formation activities. "Kids Busy Bags" are also available at the welcome table.

REMINDER TO PARENTS FOR COMMUNION SUNDAYS.

On the first Sunday of the month when the congregation celebrates the sacrament of Holy Communion, children who normally participate in "Holy Moly" Faith Formation will remain in the sanctuary with their family in worship. We know some parents welcome their children participating in the sacrament. Others want their children to wait until they are confirmed or until they have a stronger understanding of the meaning of this sacred meal of love and grace.

At St. John's UCC, Fullerton, we observe an OPEN Communion Table, which means that ALL PERSONS, regardless of age or full understanding of the sacrament, are welcome to receive. After all, how many of us as adults in our faith can fully express or explain the significance of this sacred meal. Children will stay with their parents on the first Sunday of the month to accommodate their participation in Holy Communion, as those who observe in participation, or as those who receive in participation. We have both wine and grape juice in the trays to meet the needs of all.

9:30am Morning Worship - Our faith community gathers to Worship, Love and Serve every Sunday morning! We have a place for you, one and all, and YOU ARE... WELCOME HERE! We have created places in the congregational seating for those with mobility issues and assistance support. We are working to make our spaces and worship experience more accessible for everyone, including those with hearing impairment.

Join us each week in the gathering spaces, the classrooms, the sanctuary, online, and with Sunday Social time following worship in Fox Hall. We welcome you into the experience of God's love through St. John's.

11:00am Confirmation Class for 7th & 8th Graders - Youth Room (3rd Floor)

AFFIRMING FAITH

ALL YOUTH are welcome to come to the youth room during our Sunday Social time and share with our Confirmation Class as well as spend time with other youth and grow in your faith.

Confirmation Class participants will be visiting with you during our Sunday Social time. Please look for Nicholas Santee, Aiden Hannis and Lucas Williams in the minutes before we move to our class sessions each week, or on 4th Sundays when they generally have more time to connect with the congregation. Pray for them by name each week for this time of exploring and affirming their own faith. Express your thanks for their worship participation and leadership. Join them in the journey of discovery to affirm their faith in God through Jesus Christ.

Confirmation sessions continue through the end of May with class lessons, worship experiences, service projects, church life, and learning with friends, leaders and mentors. These young men will look to YOU, the people of St. John's, to model what faith looks like. They will witness how you WORSHIP, LOVE and SERVE to create your own "No Matter What" kind of faith. What we live before them matters every single day!

As we make this Affirming Faith journey together, you are invited to get to know these guys and help them know who we are and how our lives have been changed in the love of God.

Dinner & Devotionals Wednesday Evenings During Lent

Each Wednesday evening at 6pm during Lent (beginning March 5) we will gather in Fox Hall for Dinner and Devotionals. A Soup and Bread sign up sheet will be posted on the red display board in the sanctuary for volunteers and groups to 4 different soups and some sliced bread for our shared dinner meal. 
Lenten Message & Devotional Series

Wednesday evenings and Sunday mornings in Lent, starting March 5) we will seek to open our faith to a greater experience and realization of God's love for us. With the backdrop of the book by John Pavlovitz, *If God is Love, Don't Be a Jerk! Finding a Faith that Makes Us Better Humans*, we will journey with Jesus and each other toward a deeper relationship with God. In the introduction we learn the author's intent: "This book is about the walking: about imagining what love should or could look like if we take that mandate seriously. It's about the ways a bigger God is going to yield a greater capacity to love more people, and about what that will cause us to confront and confess and jettison."

While Pavlovitz addresses many of the doctrines that are core to the Christian faith, he looks at them in new ways, particularly at the actions that result from our theological beliefs. I acknowledge in advance that John writes with a particular point of view as a decidedly progressive, liberal pastor, not afraid to deal with faith and the policies and practices that touch our lives every day. While we might disagree with some of his assertions, he shares out of his many years of pastoral experience how his faith and understanding has changed

as he has come to experience God in bigger ways, opening his own capacity for love and being a better human being. I hope you will enjoy the journey together.

Wednesday evenings will offer more conversation and interaction with the book subject matter. Each message will focus on what we can do to grow our understanding of loving God and loving our neighbor, the first and greatest commandment. Plan now to take part in worship and devotionals this Lent as we journey together toward Holy Week and the triumph of God's love this Easter.

Finding a Faith that Makes Us Better Humans"

Our worship and devotionals theme for Lent invites us to expand our experience of Love for God and Love for Each Other. Just as Jesus experienced a period of struggle in the wilderness, we too face challenges to our faith. Jesus shared his experience with his disciples so they could learn and understand from the challenges Jesus faced. As we open our lives of faith to God's love we will experience a greater connection with others. 

A Look at Ukraine on the Third Anniversary of the War

It was three years ago on February 24, 2022, that Russia conducted a full-scale invasion of Ukraine, provoking the bloodiest and most destructive war in Europe since World War II. The World Council of Churches noted with sadness that three years later, the war continues; however, there is a glimmer of hope for a cease fire and peace agreement.

The futility of this war is written in the enormous loss of lives among those in combat, civilians, and children, and the vast toll of destruction and displacement. One quarter of the pre-war population has fled the country as refugees. Essential civilian infrastructure, including schools, hospitals, and water supplies have been damaged or destroyed. Ukraine has become the most heavily mined country in the world and attacks on and around nuclear power facilities threaten an environmental catastrophe.

Over the past three years, St. John's members have made **monetary contributions amounting to over \$6,400**. Funds were sent to UCC National, the Ukrainian Orthodox Church of the USA, Project HOPE, and World Central Kitchen. Listed below is a how some of those funds have been used:



Project HOPE

- Delivered essential pharmaceuticals, medical supplies and equipment worth over \$15 million.
- Operated 64 mobile medical units and activated staff at nearly 40 health facilities.
- Trained nearly 12,000 health-care workers.
- Reconstructed and repaired 116 health and social facilities.
- Supplied 9 ambulances to equip first responders.
- Delivered nearly 9 million liters of clean drinking water and over 178,000 sanitation and hygiene supplies.

World Central Kitchen

- Served over 276+ million meals to people fleeing the front lines and provided grocery kits to families in de-occupied regions.
- Provided 2+ million gallons of water.
- Distributed 500+ million food and vegetable kits.
- Distributed 216,000+ seed kits.



While we are no longer accepting contributions for Ukraine at this time, this is just a portion of how your contributions and contributions from those around the world have helped the Ukrainian people. We continue to keep them in our prayers for a just and equitable peace.


