

So let us engage fully and expectantly in the Advent task of waiting - this season, and in the months ahead.

Advent Begins on Sunday, November 29th!

Psalm 126 opens with the line: "When the Lord restored the fortunes of Zion, we were like those who dream."

What does it look like to live as those who dream? The prophets, the psalmists, John the Baptist, Mary, Elizabeth, Joseph, Simeon, Anna, and the shepherds were all dreamers. Each one of them received, discovered, and responded to God's dreams for the world. This year during Advent, the church year's "now, but not yet" season of waiting, we will step into the mystery and awe of God's dreams and pray that they will shape our reality.



If you dream of a deeper connection with God, if you dream of a just and peace-filled world, if you dream of comfort and joy, and even if it feels like your dreams have been crushed, join us this Advent as we dream together, alongside prophets and angels. Join us as, together, we seek and sow God's dreams for our world.



DIY Advent Wreath

All it takes is five candles! Any kind, any size, although you may want to choose one candle that is a bit taller than the others for the center of your "wreath" to serve as a Christ Candle to light on Christmas Day.

The typical placement of the four Advent Candles in a circle symbolizes God's love which has no beginning and no end. Greens, which represent eternal life since they stay green year-round, are optional - be creative! If you're willing to share a photo of your wreath, we'd love to post it on our website.

We will include an Advent Candle Lighting liturgy each Sunday beginning November 29th during Zoom worship - join us in anticipating the coming of Christmas!

December Sunday School Challenge – Christmas is coming!

All children through grade 6 are invited to join us in the Field of Dreams parking lot on Sunday, November 29 at 4:00 pm for the next Sunday School Challenge! The program will last about 20-30 minutes, and each child will leave with some special Christmas surprises. Please let the church office know by November 24th if your kids, grandkids, nieces, nephews, neighbors - all are welcome! - are planning to attend.



Yes, it will look different this year, but we will still have several opportunities to celebrate the birth of Jesus, whose parents, you might remember, also had to celebrate in unusual circumstances!

Option 1: A special Christmas story, "A Most Beautiful Christmas Tree," presented in readerstheater style, will be shared in a short Christmas Eve

service designed especially for families with young children. The Zoom service will begin at 4:00 pm with Gathering Music offered by our youth. The story itself will be pre-recorded and will also be available via Facebook and YouTube by 4:30 on Christmas Eve, so if you aren't able to attend the 4:00 pm Zoom service, you can still share the story with your children before bedtime!

Option 2: It's an outdoor BYOL (Bring Your Own Light) celebration! Bring your own candle, flashlight, headlamp, tiki torch, cell phone, glow stick - whatever you choose, and come at 6:00 pm to the Field of Dreams parking lot to hear the Christmas Story and to join in singing Silent Night as we are reminded, as John 1:5 says, "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it." Masks and physical distancing will be required; please park in the Grape Street lot. This service will last no more than 20 minutes and will be held no matter the weather - come dressed appropriately, and bring your own chairs if you would prefer not to stand throughout worship.

Option 3: A traditional Christmas Eve service including lessons and carols and an uplifting Christmas message will be offered via Zoom at 8:00 PM. Pre-service gathering music will begin at 7:45. You're invited to have a candle (or flashlight, glowstick, or cellphone) ready as we join virtually together to sing Silent Night as we welcome the birth of our Glorious Lord, Precious Redeemer, Prince of Peace, Emmanuel - God with us.


"Operation Santa" – Mitten Tree Project

The Christmas Fund

The Christmas Fund is a special ministry of UCC National.
