



God comforts us in all our trouble so that we can comfort others,,,we offer the same comfort that we ourselves received from God. (2 Corinthians 1:4)

Grief and loss are a normal part of life, and sometimes it helps to know you're not alone. St. John's UCC is starting a bereavement ministry to support those dealing with the loss of a loved one, loss of a job or a change in life experiences.

We'll be offering opportunities in the fall and around the holidays in which we'll be sharing these and other helpful insights:
