In the time I have been acting as your lead pastor we certainly have had our share of both joys and challenges! You have been an amazing group to walk through the last 6 months with!

We are continuing to connect via Devotions, music, conversations, meetings over zoom and more. It is just about time for your new Sr Interim Pastor to begin and for me to say "see ya later" to the congregation. Pastoral transitions are hard both for the congregation and the pastor in transition. In order to maintain good boundaries, so that your relationship with Pastor Bonnie can begin in a healthy and positive direction, after May 24th I will no longer be available for St. John's member weddings, baptisms, funerals, pastoral care, church activities, discussions of church business/decision, etc. by phone, email, social media, or in person.

I am grateful that our faith makes it possible to accept these boundaries with positive feelings, recognizing them as what they are intended to be – signs of our love and respect for each other and our future ministries in the name of Christ.

I don't know what the future holds for St J's, each one of you individually, or for myself, yet I know it will be good! Because it will be of God! My prayers will be with all of you and I wish for you many, many blessings as we all continue to follow the paths that God is laying out for us... "see you later!"

Have you ever noticed how in the Bible it is often out of chaotic and confusing circumstances that the most amazing things emerge?

Consider the creation story: "In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep..." (Genesis 1:1) or Abraham and Sarah's grief at being unable to bear children: "Why did Sarah laugh...?" (Genesis 18:13). Or the Israelite's wilderness sojourn: "The people spoke against God and against Moses, "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we detest this miserable food." (Numbers 21:5), Saul's transformation: "Saul got up from the ground, and though his eyes were open, he could see nothing." (Acts 9:8), or the recently celebrated resurrection of Jesus: "So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them..." (Mark 16:8)

If you can take time, these are all great biblical accounts that are worth re-reading in their entirety, especially since my first Sunday with you will be Pentecost Sunday, when even as we celebrate the "birth of the church" we will be reminded of the chaos and confusion that preceded <u>that</u> momentous occasion! The sound of a rush of violent wind in the house where they were sitting? Tongues of fire resting on their heads? A cacophony of languages proclaiming God's mighty power? Accusations of drunkenness? (Acts 2:1-12) How much more disorienting could that day have been?

What's more, <u>this</u> year as we enter the season after Pentecost, also known in the liturgical calendar as "Ordinary Time," the weeks and months before us will be anything but ordinary! Not only will we be coping with the Covid-19 pandemic, St. John's will be regrouping after the retirement of a beloved Senior Pastor and a farewell to an equally beloved Assistant/Associate/Acting Lead Pastor!

It seems to me that we may approach this upcoming extraordinary time with a variety of feelings – grief, cynicism, anger, frustration, uncertainty, doubt, confusion, or even despair. However, we can also take courage, strength and hope from the biblical stories that promise us that God will continue to be with us. God's Spirit will continue to surround, inspire and challenge us, no matter what we are experiencing or feeling, as we enter this season of possibility and new growth (did you realize that's what the green paraments symbolize?), just as it did Jesus' first disciples following that first Pentecost.

I wonder... what new thing might God have in mind for St. John's in this 2020 extraordinary Ordinary Time? I'm looking forward to finding out with you!


