March Music Notes

Ash Wednesday begins the season of Lent. We will be using a series called "Roll Down, Justice!", by Dr. Marcia McFee. Music has been composed by

Mark A. Miller. We will be singing two of the songs by Mr. Miller during our Lenten worship services. Some tunes will be new and others will be familiar tunes with new words.

"Let Justice Roll" will be sung as a call to worship and also as our prayer response. "May Peace Flow" will be the sung benediction. The traditional "Lord's Prayer" will be sung the first Sunday in Lent. The offering response will be sung to the tune *Lasst Uns Erfreuen* or *All Creatures of Our God and King*. Familiar hymns will also be sung during the Lenten season. In this series we will explore our calling to proclaim God's love for all people by committing to actions of social justice in our communities.

Singing a new song scares some people. As a musician, I like to see notes as I sing something new. People tell me they can't read music. You may not be able to read the actual notes, but you can see how the words to the song are written. If words are close together, the notes go faster. If there is considerable space between words, notes are held a bit longer. Try your best when singing the new songs. Don't worry about making mistakes. No one is perfect. And I certainly make my share of mistakes.

During this Lenten season, let the liturgy and music help call us all to join together in the work of addressing justice issues in our communities.

One Great Hour of Sharing

In this newsletter you will find an insert and offering envelope for One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS). Through this all-church offering, the United Church of Christ helps people around the world whose lives have been devasted by war, natural disasters, and by lack of food or clean water. Together we can make a difference in thousands of lives through this offering. A few examples are:

♣ Aid is sent to refugee camps in the Congo, where refugees seek safety from war and genocide. Help is also given to help refugees resettle.

† In India, this offering provides small loans to families who provide much needed food to their community. Once they build up their businesses, they help the community to build wells providing clean water to their village which was affected by a severe water shortage.

[⊕] In Florida, these offerings help people who are on fixed incomes, ill, elderly, and disabled to rebuild their homes which suffered damage from hurricanes, including Hurricane Irma in 2017. Through these offerings, as well as hundreds of volunteer work teams, over 200 homes have been repaired.

Throughout the world OGHS funds are demonstrating the Love of Christ and support of congregations such as ours to help those who are in need. Your generosity and support will help to continue this life-sustaining work. One Great Hour of Sharing offerings will be received on March 22.

HealthCare Ministry

Cold and flu season is upon us. Hopefully, you were able to get vaccinated, as that is the only way that one might prevent the flu or reduce the severity of the illness. Every year thousands of people die from contracting the influenza virus. It can trigger severe inflammation in the lungs that leads to respiratory failure. The bacteria from a secondary infection can also get into your blood stream and cause sepsis which spreads throughout your whole body.

Sometimes it is hard to tell the difference between a cold and the flu as many of the symptoms are the same such as coughing, sneezing, stuffy nose and sore throat. The flu is usually more severe with symptoms such as fever, aches, chills, weakness, headache and the onset is more abrupt.

In recent news, a new threat has arisen internationally. It is a never seen before coronavirus that originated in Wuhal, China. That is what makes it scary is that not much is known about it. Symptoms so far seem to mimic a flu-type virus. So far, about 2,000 people have been infected with the virus and 76 have died. Most of the infected are from China or have traveled from Wuhal, China recently and were infected while there. The virus spreads easily from a cough or sneeze of an infected person. Five people are infected in the US so far that traveled from Wuhal, China. Great efforts to limit travel from China, check people at airports traveling to and from China are being done to help limit the spread of this coronavirus. In China, citizens are encouraged to wear protective masks to help prevent the spread of the virus.

We will surely learn more as time moves on about how this virus works. In the meantime, to help minimize your chances of catching any of these bugs, here are a few tips to keep in mind.

- 1. Avoid close contact with people who are sick. If a family member is sick, it may help to invest in some masks to minimize the spread of the virus.
- 2. Stay home when you are sick.
- 3. Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- 4. Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands.
- 5. Wash your hands often with soap and water or alcohol based cleaner.
- 6. Disinfect surfaces that you touch often such as kitchen and bathroom countertops and fixtures and doorknobs.

PLEASE NOTE: In the weeks following of me writing this article, the coronavirus is now called Covid-19. Most cases are still in China where it originated. It has spread to 25 countries now. It is a highly contagious virus, but not as deadly as SARS or the flu can be. The amount of people with confirmed infection of COVID19 is about 60,000 worldwide with about 1,400 deaths so far. ~ Diane Buss
