As I write this article, your Consistory President is contacting the people Consistory have selected to serve on St. John's Pastoral Search Committee. Their task of appointing a Search Committee was made both easier and harder by all of you – they asked, and you gave them a large number of excellent candidates to choose from, but the fact that all the nominees were very well qualified made narrowing down the list a challenge!

Considering the wisdom shared by PNEC Minister Rev. Dr. Bonnie Bates – seeking to appoint a group that both represents the congregation (younger and older, new and long-time members, male and female, etc.) and will be trusted as they conduct the search on your behalf – Consistory also attended to the Spirit before they made their final decision, which was unanimous!

So what happens now? St. John's Search Committee will be officially installed during an upcoming service of worship. Then, a representative from the PNEC Search and Call Team will orient the Search Committee to the work before them. They will begin preparing St. John's "Local Church Profile," which will describe our church to potential candidates with answers to the questions "Who are we?" Who are our neighbors?" and "Who is God calling us to become?" that will be formulated with input from all members of our congregation.

This process will likely take several months; the Search Committee will keep the congregation apprised of their progress.

"Seek and ye shall find," Jesus said. Let us trust in that promise, and hold in our prayers both the Search Committee as they begin seeking St. John's next Senior Pastor AND that very pastor who is out there somewhere, seeking the place where God is calling them to go and serve with energy, imagination, faithfulness and love.

Church Reopening Task Force Recommendation



Consistory approved the Church Reopening Task Force's recommendation, that due to the increasing number of COVID cases in our area, the earliest we might have in-person worship is the beginning of December. The Task Force continues to meet and monitor the situation. You can always call the church office and press extension #5 for church building updates.


