"Jesus, looking at [the rich young ruler], loved him and said, 'You lack one thing; go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.' When he heard this, he was shocked and went away grieving, for he had many possessions." Mark 10:21-22



There's a scene in the wonderful movie, "Finding Nemo," where Marlin, Nemo's father, weighed down with grief and guilt after Nemo's disappearance confesses, "I promised I'd never let anything happen to him." Marlin's faithful friend on the search to find Nemo is temporarily taken aback. "Hmmmmm," Dory replies after a momentary silence. "That's a funny thing to promise somebody. If you never let anything happen to somebody, then nothing would ever happen to them!"

It's thought provoking wisdom for parents, but Dory's words are also, I believe, helpful words for Christians who are seeking to be faithful followers of Jesus. You see, Jesus never promised that life would be perfect for his followers, but he did say that the reason he came was that we might have life, and have it abundantly (see John 10:10). And abundant life, as both Marlin and the rich man in Mark's gospel sadly realized, is not always what we think it is. Sometimes, in order to take hold of the abundance that Jesus offers to us, we need to let go of the things we think guarantee us happiness and safety and security. In other words, like Dory said, in order for something to happen to us, we need to <u>risk</u> letting something happen to us!

What might Jesus be asking you to take a chance on? To volunteer to serve on Consistory or another church committee? To make a phone call to that estranged family member or friend? To give away something that you own to make room for what God wants to give you?

May we all, like Nemo's dad, learn how to let go of anything that stymies our ability to live the lives God has in mind for us. Only then will we be able to fully receive the abundant life offered to us through Christ Jesus.

#### Why do we need to take attendance at outdoor worship?

A member of our Healthcare Ministry keeps track of who is present at our in-person services of worship, and retains the list of names for two weeks. If someone who was present at worship should test positive for Covid-19, contract tracing will be easy, and people who may have had contact with that potentially infectious person can take appropriate action to minimize any further spread of the virus.

#### **Transition Team Update**

St. John's Transition Team has been hard at work this past month! Our six-person group was appointed by Consistory to work with the Interim Pastor to help St. John's be fully ready to call a new senior pastor. We assessed the need for work on various tasks typically addressed during the interim period. In line with this, we reviewed St. John's Constitution and by-laws and recommended to Consistory wording revisions to improve the document's clarity and accuracy. We are also looking at *Mission InSite*, a resource made available by the Pennsylvania Northeast Conference to help us accurately identify the demographics, beliefs, and practices of our local community.

Perhaps most importantly, the team determined that it is time to officially begin the search process for St. John's next senior pastor. This recommendation was shared with and approved by Consistory! To learn how <u>you</u> can be involved in this important search process, please see page 4 of this newsletter for the article, "St. John's Pastoral Search Committee is Being Formed."

In the meantime, the Transition Team is designing a project that will invite the whole congregation to help uncover our congregation's core values. Identification of these specific core values is an important part of our congregational profile. The profile will be central to both the Search Committee's formal call for a Senior Pastor, as well as the continued work and growth of St. John's as a faith community. The project starts with the collection of some of your most significant memories of St. John's over the years. Details are available on the flier enclosed with this newsletter.

#### St. John's Pastoral Search Committee is Being Formed!

At its September meeting, the SJF Consistory voted to begin the process to call St. John's next Senior Pastor. They agreed that the following qualities and attributes are desirable for members of the Pastoral Search Committee:

- ♣ Organized
- ♣ Open-minded and respectful of differences and other's opinions
- ♣ Able to look at the big picture

- Passionately invested in church
- ₱ 100% able to hold confidences
- Patient, Empathetic, Positive attitude
- ₱ Willing to accept a large time commitment
- ♣ Insightful
- Person of faith
- ‡ Experienced with group dynamics/ group decision making/ interacting with groups
- **†** Good communication skills



The entire congregation is invited to nominate people to serve on the Pastoral Search Committee! All church members are encouraged to give this important task prayerful consideration and submit names to the Church Office by Friday, October 9th. A nominee does not have to have ALL of the qualities listed above, but please keep the list in mind as you consider who you would like to nominate to serve on the Pastoral Search Committee. Please feel free to nominate yourself if you feel called to serve in this capacity.

#### Then...

- 1. Consistory will meet on October 13th to review the nominations and form the "Dream Team" Pastoral Search Committee. Per SJF's by-laws, it is Consistory's responsibility to appoint a Search Committee consisting of a broad representation of congregational members.
- 2. Once the Search Committee is finalized, they will meet with the Penn Northeast Conference liaison who will provide guidance for the next steps of the search process. Ultimately, per SJF's by-laws, "following a service at which a trial sermon by the candidate recommended by the Search Committee is preached, a vote shall be taken at a congregational meeting called for that purpose. A favorable written ballot yielding an affirmative vote at 90% shall constitute a call for St. John's new Senior Pastor."

#### So how long will it take before we find our next Senior Pastor?

Short answer: Only God knows!

**Longer answer**: The Search Committee needs to prepare a Local Church Profile that describes St. John's UCC Fullerton and includes answers to the questions, "Who are we?" "Who is our neighbor?" and "Who is God calling us to become?" This will take several months to complete, and all church members will be asked for input along the way. Once the Local Church Profile is in circulation, the Search Committee will begin receiving ministerial profiles from interested candidates. How long it takes before the Search Committee recommends a candidate to the congregation will depend on many factors, including who is available during the time the church is searching.



## Pastor Emerita Service for Rev. Dr. Becky Beckwith

St. John's UCC, Fullerton will have a special service on Sunday, October 4, 2020 at 4:00PM in the Field of Dreams to honor Rev. Dr. Becky Beckwith as our Pastor Emerita. comes with no duties but allows Pastor Becky to be a loved and respected part of our congregation and worship with her family. The PNEC Conference Minister Rev. Dr. Bonnie Bates will be joining us and may speak briefly as well as participate in the Emerita liturgy.

#### Our Faith, Our Vote!

'Shout out, do not hold back! Lift up your voice like a trumpet!' - Isaiah 58:1 "In Hebrew Scripture the word most often translated "voice" is "qol." This is also the word translated as noise, or sound, or vote. In a broader sense, I would say the

Hebrew word, qol, simply means letting oneself be heard. Using our voice to make a sound is certainly one way to be heard, and using our vote is another.

Our vote is the means we have to make an impactful noise about the local, state and national issues that concern us. Voting is a powerful tool, and this is why we see so many focused efforts targeted at voter disenfranchisement. This is why districts are redrawn and political parties engage in gerrymandering. This is why voting rights legislation and access to the polls is constantly being challenged. No matter your opinion or political affiliation, your voice - your vote - matters and you deserve to be heard."

#### October 2020 Music Notes

How many of you miss singing? I know I do. And yes, we are singing during our zoom worship services, but we can only hear the song leader and ourselves. When it is only you, sing out joyfully as you praise the Lord.

That's how the communion hymn for Sunday, October 4<sup>th</sup>, should be sung. It is "I Come with Joy" and the words are printed below for you to read.

It was written by Brian A. Wren, born in 1936, in England. He is a major British figure in the revival of contemporary hymn writing. He was ordained in 1965 as a Congregational Church, now United Reformed, pastor. He now resides in the United States where he is active as a freelance lecturer, preacher, and full-time hymn writer.

Wren wrote this communion hymn in July 1968 and revised it several times. He wrote this text to summarize a series of sermons on the meaning of the Lord's Supper, illustrating the presence of Christ in the sacrament. He wanted to express this as simply as possible to take the worshipper from an individual approach to communion to an understanding of many. The text contains the themes remembrance, sharing bread and wine in communion with the saints and with Christ in His presence, and of Christian service.

This truly is a hymn of joy and praise.

#### **CROP Hunger Walk**



Due to the coronavirus pandemic, this year's CROP Hunger Walk will take place differently and according to Covid-19 guidelines. You have two options of ways to participate:

- 1. From October 1 to October 11, you can WALK anytime, anywhere, on your own, in your own family group carrying CROP Hunger Walk signs and posting photos/videos on social media when possible. Wearing masks and social distancing is required.
- 2. On Sunday, October 11, you can DRIVE or RIDE in a vehicle decorated with CROP Hunger Walk signs. This will be a 10-mile/30-minute loop from St. Timothy's Lutheran Church, 140 S. Ott St. in Allentown, at assigned times between 1:00 p.m. and 2:30 p.m. The route takes you past the Allentown Ecumenical Food Bank and the Lehigh County Conference of Churches Soup Kitchen, both of which receive the "local" portion of the Greater Allentown CROP Hunger Funds.

Two-thirds of the offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries to fund an array of local and national initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects. One-third of the offering also supports the UCC's Council for American Indian Ministries (CAIM).
