Currently, CDC is recommending that moderately to severely immunocompromised people receive an additional dose. Here are some of the groups who should really get a third shot, but always talk to your healthcare provider to see if third dose is appropriate.

- active cancer treatment for tumors or cancers of the blood
- 2. received an organ transplant and are taking medicine to suppress the immune system
- 3. received a stem cell transplant within the last 2 years or are taking medicine to suppress the immune system
- 4. advanced or untreated HIV infection
- 5. active treatments with high-dose corticosteroids

#### CROP Hunger Walk

The Crop Project was organized in 1947 when farmers were asked to donate food and seed crops to our hungry neighbors in post-World War II Europe and Asia. The program soon became known as the **C**hristian **R**ural **O**verseas **P**rogram—**CROP**. In 1969 in Bismarck, ND, and in 1970 in York, PA, the first events were organized to raise funds to support CROP.



CROP Hunger Walks have become community-based events held in cities across the United States, raising dollars to support the global mission of Church World Service to eradicate hunger and poverty. Twenty-five percent of the funds raised stay within our local community to support the Ecumenical Food Bank and the Lehigh Conference of Churches' Conference Kitchen.

This year you can take part in this event or be a sponsor. You can get involved in several ways to help raise funds:

- On Sunday, October 10, beginning at 1:30 p.m. at St. Timothy's Lutheran Church (140 S. Ott St., Allentown), drive or ride in a vehicle on a 10-mile/30-minute loop.
- Walk on your own or with a group, anytime, anywhere from October 1-10.
- Sponsor a participant in the event.

Two-thirds of the offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries to fund an array of local and national initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects. One-third of the offering also supports the UCC's Council for American Indian Ministries (CAIM).

Alabama and Mississippi. As it turned into a tropical depression, it traveled up the East coast bringing destruction and flooding to homes, businesses, streets, and loss of life. Especially hard hit were New York, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania.
