

Music at St. John's

<u>Songs</u>

Hymns and songs can have great power, are often important to us, and are the church's most resonant and expressive form of worship. They are often linked with certain memories and associations, but many other factors are at play. Hymns are rich in their use of language, are poetic in form, and use symbol and metaphor to convey meaning. When such language is vivid and vital, it works not only at a cerebral level, but appeals to our imaginations and emotions to reach the depths of heart and mind. Rhyme, rhythm and repetition are used to intensify the experience.

Hymns are written to be sung, usually corporately, and as such, hymn-singing is participatory, a communal act. Embodied-singing engages the whole of our bodies, and so hymns can become living performances of faith and worship. This aspect of rehearsal and performance gives hymns the capacity even to shape faith. What is initiated as an expression of faith becomes, as well, a method of faith development. I'm sure there are times in our churches when all of us say or sing things we're not really sure we believe; but nonetheless the constant repetition of statements must have its effect.

The act of singing a hymn will often bring about the state of mind that is expressed or desired — for example, a sense of joy and wonder, or of guilt and unworthiness. Hymns have the power to shape the faith of individuals and the community.

Now the dreaded part—NEW HYMNS! How dare these composers update text or change the lyrics to a well known hymn tune! Believe it or not, new hymn writing is of vital importance. If we are to aim for an honest expression and shaping of faith for our contemporary world, then we need hymns which express that. We need hymns which are inclusive, and which speak of the transitions of human experience — including traditional rites of passage as well as those transitions often overlooked or forgotten. We also need hymns that are appropriate for secular or interfaith occasions.

Music in some form or another has been part of religious worship since the time of the Psalmists. Hymns, with their rhyme and rhythm, their poetic imagery, their memories and associations, are embedded in our individual thinking and our communal worship — they are an integral part of heartfelt worship! So Keep on Singing!



In Case You Missed This...


Our Pastor Emerita, Rev. Dr. Becky Beckwith, had an article posted in the "Faith and Values" column of the Morning Call on Saturday, August 3. It was entitled "God Bestows the Gift of Laughter." Inspired by Genesis 21:6, the article refers to the message given by God to Sarah. Pastor Becky goes on to say how laughter is both spiritually and physically healthy and for us to make a conscious effort to find time for laughter in our lives. 

Take the Climate Hope Voter Pledge

With the success of the 2023 Climate Hope Cards campaign, the UCC will be conducting another Climate Hope campaign in 2024. Through past General Synod resolutions, the UCC has made strong commitments to climate action at the federal level of the U.S. government, transitioning from fossil fuels to renewable energy by 2040, and affirming the intersectionality of climate justice with all justice issues. In a survey of local lead organizers, it was determined that top priorities for 2024 include electing climate justice champions to Congress and advocating for legislation that addresses environmental racism and the harms faced by front-line communities.



The care of God's creation is a central calling of Christians and has found unique expression in the life of the United Church of Christ. Leaders from the UCC were integral to the launch of the environmental justice movement in the 1980s. As Christians we are called beyond our individual lives to love our neighbor and to care for all of God's creation. In 2024 the UCC has launched its second campaign called "Vote for Climate Hope." St. John's UCC will again take part in this campaign. Look for your voter pledge card in this newsletter, in a future bulletin, and on the table in the lounge area. By taking the Climate Hope Voter Pledge, you are making a sacred commitment to a more just and equitable world for people of all ages, races, and walks of life. To make your pledge online, simply scan the QR Code on the card. Cards can also be turned back into the office or placed in the offering plate. The deadline to return all cards or to pledge online is Sunday, October 13.

The steps taken and the funds that are raised together will provide life-saving support including emergency food and resources, along with the seeds, tools and programs that will help families feed themselves in the future.



This year's CROP Hunger Walk is scheduled for Sunday, October 13, starting at 1:30pm at St. Timothy's Lutheran Church located at 140 S. Ott Street in Allentown. Walkers are needed and church members can sponsor our walkers with your donations. There are two options for walkers:

- 10K Route with refreshments available at the Allentown Ecumenical Food Bank, Lehigh Conference of Churches (formerly Dubbs Memorial UCC), St. James UCC, and St. Timothy's.
- "Golden Mile" Route through the Hamilton Park neighborhood with refreshments available at St. Timothy's.

The CROP Hunger Walk helps food-insecure neighbors locally through the Lehigh Conference of Churches Kitchen and the Allentown Area Ecumenical Food Bank. CROP Walk funds also support Church World Service's life-saving disaster assistance, displacement assistance, and long-term development assistance with our neighbors throughout the United States and around the globe, including victims of the humanitarian crises in Ukraine and Gaza.
