A More Perfect Union

"That They May All Be One!"

If you've been around the UCC for any length of time, you've seen this scripture quoted, "...that they may all be one." It is a shining light in our churches as we strive to be united and uniting. The Bible verse "that they all may be one" appears in John 17:21, which is part of Jesus' High Priestly Prayer: "That they all may be one, just as you, God, are in me, and I in you, that they also may be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me."

In this prayer, Jesus refers to the unity of purpose and intent among his disciples. The prayer's main themes include love and unity, Christ, and the faith and courage of his disciples. In the United Church of Christ, we believe that each person is on a spiritual journey and that each of us is at a different stage of that journey. We believe that the persistent search for God produces an authentic relationship with God, engendering love, strengthening faith, dissolving guilt, and giving life purpose and direction.

In a Pastoral Letter to the UCC, January 2019, then General Minister and President, Rev. Dr. John Dorhauer wrote, "The vision of a body united –in purpose, in mission, in vision – is one that inspired the birth of our denomination. All of our spiritual impulses reverberate in an effort to call us into a more perfect union."

"Throughout our shared history as a people of faith and as a part of the Body of Christ, we have challenged ourselves to widen the circle of inclusion. Widening the circle has always come with growth pains as we shed old skins and welcome those whom we had previously thought unwelcome. And, with each new articulation of a more fully expressed Body of Christ we have realized new joy. Through it all we remain focused on the call to be one and committed to meeting the challenges inherent in that call."

People in Jesus' day were as divided about Jesus' teaching as we are today, and yet, the day will come when all who seek to love God with all their heart, soul, mind and strength, and their neighbors as themselves will be one, even in the midst of difference.



KEYSTONECONFERENCE

In the next few weeks, we will cast our votes, not only for national, state and local elections, but in our UCC region as well. Over the last two years, we have been presented information through the Keystone Working Group, a collective of pastors and layleaders from across the four Pennsylvania area UCC conferences, proposing we merge and

form a new Keystone Conference of the UCC. That vote will be on November 9, and we will have our votes shared. DonnaLee Yeatts, Tyler Shankweiler and I all want to know how you feel about this proposed merger.

As we consider who we are now and who we can become together, may we seek that more perfect union... that we may all be one in the love and grace of our gracious, still speaking, still creating God. May we choose to love God, love our neighbors and love ourselves. We are St. John's UCC, Fullerton, and "We Worship, We Love and We Serve ~ No Matter What!"

Music at St. John's

Believe it or not, one of the hardest things to do as a music director, or for me at least, is selecting choral anthems. There are so many pieces out there, where does one even begin to look? For me, it first starts with listening to the song. Is the choir capable of singing this piece or, are the bell ringers able to play and do the piece justice? Next part is programming, where does it fit in relation to the scriptures for Sunday worship? Part three, how does this piece push the choir or bell ringers? Does it pose a challenge? Part four, as a music director, at least for me, how do I teach the music to the choir, soloist, bell ringers, so that it makes an impact on not only those singing or playing it, but also on the persons in the pew listening, searching for whatever they need at that moment?

One piece that came to me when I needed it the most, was in 2017 when I lost my best friend Kristin to a freak car accident and was contemplating walking away from being a music director. That piece is known as "I Am With You" by Chris Anderson and Greg Habegger. The history of this piece is that on Saturday, July 27th, 2013, the lives of young people from Colonial Hills Baptist Church of Indianapolis, Indiana were changed forever. Returning from a trip, just a mile from home, their bus crashed, injuring many and taking the lives of their youth pastor, his wife, their unborn child, and another mother. Just days before the tragedy, Chris Anderson wrote this text as an encouragement for Christians in the midst of difficulties. Little did he know how fitting it would be for grieving families, a grieving church, and a grieving Christian community. This piece was first introduced as part of the funeral service for the youth pastor and his family. This piece now stands as a powerful reminder of God's presence in our lives during even the most heartbreaking of times.

I Am with You, says the Father; through the floods I calm and keep.
Though the swelling waves surround you, I surround the waters deep.
Fear not, loved one; feel my presence. You will never be alone.
Trust me, loved one; you are precious. You are Mine-My very own.

I Am with You, says the Savior, even to the age's end.

Never leaving, nor forsaking, I'm your ever present Friend.

Fear not, loved one; hear My comfort: none can pluck you from My hand.

Trust Me, loved one; I am constant: none can change what I have planned.

I Am with You, says the Spirit, there is nowhere you can flee.

Neither height nor depth can hide you, every place is home to Me.

Fear not, loved one, hear my witness, you are God's own child and heir.

Trust Me, loved one, hear my whisper, deep within you, I am here.

Come be with Me, says the Master, greeting hopeful, homesick eyes.

I was with you through your journey; be with Me in paradise.

Trust Me, loved one, know My promise; I will surely quickly come.

Trust Me, loved one, know my purpose, I will bring you safely home.

I am with you, come be with me, safely home.

"Ordinary Time"

in the Season of Pentecost October Worship Series

Fall is here and as the seasons change, our thoughts turn to how we experience God in our ever changing lives. During the month of October we celebrate who we are as a Christian community, with a foundation of prayer in our relationship with God.

"We the People," the affirmation which begins the preamble of the US Constitution, not only reminds us of our nation's founding, but also of who we are today. Then as now, our daily purpose remains... "in order to form a more perfect union." The words of the Constitution set the course and give us direction for our journey together as a nation. Still today, our journey of faith echoes the prayer of Jesus, "that they may all be one," and we explore more deeply the prayer pattern and words Jesus taught us in order to share more deeply with God and our neighbors.

This October, our worship messages will explore The Lord's Prayer and we will also take comfort and affirmation in the words of the writers of Psalms. We will pray, learn, sing and share together the prayer that we say every week in various forms to guide us. "We the People," the people of Jesus, are called to a season of prayer.

October 6 - World Communion Sunday

Worship with Holy Communion

We the People: Guided to Praise
Psalm 8:1-9

Prayer often begins with words of praise. In this affirmation, "O LORD, our Sovereign, how majestic is your name in all the earth! You have set your glory above the heavens," the psalm writer opens our hearts to experience God's greatness! We begin our series and celebrate World Communion Sunday with words of praise, affirming our "more perfect union" in relationship with God and each other.

October 13

We the People: Guided to Know God Psalm 90:12-17

"Satisfy us in the morning with your steadfast love, so that we may rejoice and be glad all our days," shares the psalm writer. When we pray for God to meet our needs each day, "give us this day our daily bread," our primary expression is to know God's love... believing that "nothing shall separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus."

October 20

We the People: Guided to Assurance Psalm 91:9-16

The psalmist speaks God's voice of assurance, writing, "When they call to me, I will answer them; I will be with them in trouble; I will rescue them and honor them." When we pray, we come seeking the heart of God, longing to be a better people. We look to God to give us hope and confidence, believing God is with us, guiding us with grace and hope.

October 27

We the People: Guided to Praise
Psalm 34:1-8

Just as we began this series with praise, the psalm writer celebrates God's goodness, urging us to join in, saying, "I will bless the LORD at all times; God's praise shall continually be in my mouth." The Lord's Prayer is an invitation to be one with God, to celebrate who we are together in relationship with God and each other, and to affirm God's holiness and love in all of life.

St. John's Kitchen Corner



Let me share with you a few things today about St. John's kitchen and how to find something. Each month I will pick a different part to walk you through.

Today come walk with me to the back right corner where the pantry is found. As you open the door to the pantry you will find a detailed list on the door of everything that is in there. I

have found that most people don't like to read detailed lists!

So here is a brief synopsis for your reading pleasure. As you enter, the light switch is on the left. To your right is a small walk-in area. On these shelves you will find all paper and plastic goods including plates, bowls, napkins, cups and tableware. On the left shelves, you can find creamers and sugars, storage bags and garbage bags, saran wrap and aluminum foil, straws and stirrers. There are disposable serving gloves and other less-used things on the upper shelves. As you continue your tour to the rear of the pantry you will find fund-raising supplies, to-go and leftover containers, large kitchen supplies, crock pots and other electric kitchen items. The very rear of the pantry holds Colleen's decorative items for special events.

I hope you enjoyed our little tour of the pantry! Now let's talk about money. \$\$ The kitchen is allotted a small budget each year which is used to cover the replacement of paper and plastic goods, coffee and cold drinks for some church social events including Sunday Social hour. All donation money that folks put in the donation bank during social hour is counted each week and handed in to the church treasurer who adds that money towards the kitchen budget so we can continue to stock the kitchen shelves. As you can imagine, since we now have a weekly social hour and many other new events throughout the year, the cost to maintain it all is higher. All of the new appliances and coffee makers in the kitchen were generously donated.

This is all good stuff! We are a "happening" and hungry church! As we begin a new season I am thankful to all who have contributed in any way to keep St. John's Kitchen a happy place!

Convenience Costs

Using Your Credit / Debit Cards for Your Support

In recent months, the Stewardship and Finance Committee has been looking for ways to make paying for activities, fundraising and events more convenient for those who want to pay using their credit or debit cards. We've learned that these conveniences come with some cost and we want to be sure all are aware. Here's what we need to know and how we all can help.

First, if you use your credit/debit card for transactions, they are encrypted and secure.

Second, please help us cover the costs assessed to St. John's for each transaction.

When using a card for transactions with us, please be aware that there is a \$0.45



transaction fee plus a 2.85 % processing fee that we pay for most major credit cards. American Express has a \$0.45 transaction fee plus a 3.5 % processing fee.

St. John's cannot provide for the convenience without passing along the processing fee. Previously, we had been covering the transaction fee. We now need to extend that convenience cost as well. So, please opt to add the \$0.45 transaction fee to your total and pay the processing fee.

We hope the ability to use a credit/debit card is a convenience and benefit you will enjoy and make good use of in your support of the ministries of St. John's UCC.

Required Minimum Distributions

As we continue our journey together in faith and service, the Stewardship & Finance Committee want to share some important information about a unique opportunity that could benefit both you and our beloved St. John's UCC, Fullerton.

For those over the age of 70 who have Individual Retirement Accounts (IRAs), we want to bring your attention to the concept of Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs). This may sound like financial jargon, but we assure you, it carries significant potential benefits for both your financial situation and our community's continued growth and impact.

What is a QCD, you may ask? A QCD is a distribution from your IRA that can be directed straight to a qualified charity — such as St. John's — without counting as taxable income. This means that the amount you donate through a QCD can help satisfy your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) for the year, effectively reducing your taxable income and potentially lowering your overall tax liability.

Here are some key benefits of making a QCD:

Tax Savings: By directing your IRA distribution to St. John's UCC, Fullerton through a QCD, you can lower your taxable income, potentially leading to significant tax savings. This allows you to support our mission and ministry while also maximizing your tax benefits.

Fulfilling Charitable Goals: Your generous donation through a QCD directly supports the vital work of our St. John's community. Whether it's providing resources for our outreach programs, supporting our worship services, or maintaining our beautiful facilities, your contribution makes a tangible difference in the lives of others.



Neighbors in Need

"God will not falter or lose heart until justice prevails throughout the earth." ~ Isaiah 42:4



This year, the Neighbors in Need theme is "Mental Health Justice for All." In 2015, the General Synod of the UCC passed a resolution to become WISE (Welcoming, Inclusive, Supportive, and Engaged) for mental health. A just world for

all is a world where the human rights and well-being of people with mental health challenges are respected, no matter who you are or where you are in life's mental health journey. World Mental Health Day is celebrated on October 10.

Two-thirds of the offering is used by UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries to provide grants to UCC churches and organizations as well as supporting a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects. One-third of the offering supports the Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM).

Enclosed with this newsletter is a special offering envelope and insert. The NIN offering will be received at worship on Sunday, October 6, and continue to the end of October.

Have You Completed the Climate Hope Voter Pledge Card?

Through past General Synod resolutions, the UCC has made strong commitments to climate action at the federal level of the U.S. government.



It was determined that top priorities for 2024 include electing climate justice champions to Congress and advocating for legislation that addresses environmental racism and the harms faced by frontline communities. As Christians, we are called beyond our individual lives to love our neighbor and to care for all of God's creation.

For 2024, the UCC launched its second climate campaign called "Vote for Climate Hope." St. John's is again participating in this campaign. A voter pledge card was in the September newsletter, in the worship bulletin on September 8, and can also be found on the table in the lounge area. By taking the Climate Hope Voter Pledge, you are making a sacred commitment to a more just and equitable world for people of all ages, races, and walks of life. Completed cards can be turned back into the office or placed in the offering plate. You can also make your pledge online by simply scanning the QR Code on the card. The deadline to return all cards or to pledge online is Sunday, October 13.

Greater Allentown CROP Hunger Walk

CROP Hunger Walks are community-led interfaith events that raise funds to end hunger locally and around the world. This year's CROP Hunger Walk is scheduled for Sunday, October 13, starting at 1:30 p.m. at St. Timothy's Lutheran Church located at 140 S. Ott Street in Allentown.
