Pastor's Message: The Collars of Justice Inspired by Ruth Bader Ginsburg

I recently ran across a book titled "The Collars of RBG: A Portrait of Justice" which features photos of some of the collars worn by Justices Ruth Bader Ginsburg and Sandra Day O'Connor. These women were not only judicial icons, but people of great character who could battle with the best legal minds of opposing viewpoints and enjoy the company and conversation, and have deep friendship as well. I love that Justice Ginsburg said "My mother told me to be a lady. And for her, that meant be your own person, be independent." Justice Ginsburg also said "Fight for the things that you care about, but do it in a way that will lead others to join you." Their iconic collars worn with the judicial robes became an enduring symbol to many of the strength of justice and compassion.

The phrase "Speak the truth, even if your voice shakes" has been appearing frequently, which led me to find its source: Maggie Kuhn, founder of the Gray Panthers. The whole quote is worth our attention: "Leave safety behind. Put your body on the line. Stand before the people you fear and speak your mind – even if your voice shakes. When you least expect it, someone may actually listen to what you have to say. Well-aimed slingshots can topple giants. And do your homework." The most powerful part is "Speak your mind, even if your




voice shakes," of course. But the most important part is "Do your homework."

Fear and Apathy are too often our enemies. If we are feeling fear right now, we can't let it immobilize us. What can we do about fear? Take action! That thought may make us afraid, too. That's OK. Push through and past that fear, and get busy. Get into some "Good Trouble!" William Lloyd Garrison, the great 19th-century abolitionist, has been much on my mind lately, and I was floored when I discovered that he wrote this: "The apathy of the people is enough to make every statue leap from its pedestal and hasten the resurrection of the dead." Doing nothing is not an appropriate tribute to Justice Ginsburg - or the late Representative John Lewis, for that matter, or Sen. Corey Booker, in his record breaking, inspiring speech, This Moral Moment.

In the fight for Marriage Equality, I found it important to represent the Christian faith that stands in support of Diversity, Equality and Inclusion. I watched my previous denomination be torn apart by rigid ideology which was consistently acting in ways that did not reflect God's ALL inclusive love. So, I found my voice for justice. I started showing up at protests and other events, wearing my clergy collar and stole. There were times I addressed a legislative body or City Council, or even State Senate. I wore the visible symbols of my position and my faith, whether I was on the agenda to speak or simply standing alongside others whose voices I hoped to help elevate with my presence.

We can all do the same, collars or not. Stand up. Show our solidarity. Speak out. Speak truthfully. Speak from a place of knowledge. Speak from a place of compassion. Our words may not be perfect and our voices may be shaking. We are called to a holy work, a moral moment. So join together. Wear your collar of justice, whatever it may be, and together, let us be those who love, in grace and hope. We are St. John's UCC, Fullerton, and...

"I Remember It Well" – Reflections at 60

There's something about this birthday that feels different. On May 12, I'll turn 60, and while I don't mind growing older—I've never feared the number itself—this milestone has stirred up something deeper in me. A sense of reflection. A quiet inventory of life. I've begun to notice those quiet "I wish I had..." or "I wish I hadn't..." moments that sneak in when you've lived long enough to collect both joys and regrets.

Sixty years of life gives you a lot to remember. So much of my journey has been shaped by family and faith—relationships that were lovingly built, and some, painfully broken. I often think back to childhood, to moments that now feel golden. There were things I treasured so deeply as a kid that I wanted my own children to experience—things I tried to pass on. But life moves differently in different decades. Living far from each other in different states, our experiences naturally became different, too. Still, we found new ways to create connection, to build memories—some planned, some that snuck up on us in the best ways. Maybe not everything turned out how I envisioned, but so much beauty was made anyway.

When I look back, I feel a strong pull of gratitude. I was loved well. That's a rare and sacred gift. My childhood wasn't perfect, but it was rich in the things that matter: laughter, guidance, stability, and a deep, abiding sense of belonging. I remember it well.

The church—oh, the church has always been the heartbeat of my story. From early on, it was my center, my compass, my home away from home. It wasn't just a place I went; it was a people I belonged to. Through their love, I met a Savior who called me by name, and I found a faith that wasn't just inherited, but chosen. I said yes to that invitation—not just once, but every day since.

God, in God's mystery and generosity, entrusted me with something sacred: a calling. Over these six decades, I've been blessed to serve 17 congregations across two denominations. From tiny chapels to bustling sanctuaries, in towns big and small, each one became a place where my calling took root and grew. Thirty-nine of my 60 years have been spent in ministry, walking with people in moments of great joy and deep sorrow. Baptizing, marrying, burying. Preaching, praying, laughing, crying. It has been the honor of my life.

And then, there's the sacred chapter of fatherhood. I'm the proud parent of four incredible and unique human beings: Erin, Jacob, Meagan, and Jon. Nothing could have prepared me for the way they would expand my heart. Each of them carries part of me, and yet they've all become their own beautiful people in ways I couldn't have imagined. And now, the joy multiplies—literally—with grandchildren. I am "Grandpa"—what a title! To three biological grandchildren: Christopher, Jaxson, and Joshua; to three amazing bonus grandchildren: Anthony, Max, and Aerial; and to two more grandsons on the way, Xander and Elishah, still "in development." Woohoo! What a legacy. What a gift. I remember holding each child, realizing that life was starting all over again in them—and I had the chance to be part of their stories, too.

Coming to understand and embrace my identity as a gay man—and holding that truth alongside being a father and grandfather—opened the door to a more authentic way of living and loving. In time, that truth made space for a loving relationship with my life partner and husband, Bill. Our journey together has looked different than anything I once imagined, but it has taught me that love is far less about biology or labels and far more about truly seeing another person, allowing myself to be seen, and choosing to love with intention and courage. Together, we've built a life rich with meaning and unexpected ministry adventures that have taken us to places we never planned. We've walked alongside our mothers as they aged with grace and dignity, learning to love them in deeper ways especially when my own mom came to live with us and we created a home together in Pennsylvania.

There are things I would do differently, of course. Hindsight is a precise teacher. I wish I had slowed down more, worried less, taken better care of myself, definitely called more often and spent the money to visit, even when I didn't have it to spare. I wish I had taken some more chances, and not taken others. Yet I don't live in the shadow of regret — I live in the light of learning. And through it all, I remember.

I remember the laughter, the songs, the sanctuary moments, the long car rides, the school teacher meetings, the movie marathons, the moving, the moving, the moving, the moving... lol! And I remember the unexpected grace, the broken pieces that still glowed with love. I remember the people who shaped me, walked with me, and made me better. I remember how faith has never left me, even when I questioned it. God put many commas in my life where I thought life gave me endings. And I remember how love, in all its forms, has carried me — over every mountain and through every valley.

Sixty years. It feels strange, yes. But it also feels sacred. And I remember it well.

8:30am Adult Faith Formation - The Friendship Sunday School Class meets in Room 201, to accommodate those with physical mobility needs. All are welcome to topical studies, biblical reflection and group discussion, led by various class members. Anyone needing assistance, please use the Grape Street elevator entrance and come to the sanctuary level. There's always great conversation and some tasty treats to start your Sunday morning well! Contact Tom and Emilie Moyer for more information. The class concludes the program year on May 18, with a special Pennsylvania Dutch lunch out! There will be no class on May 25 for Memorial Day weekend.

9:30am Children's Faith Formation - Children gather with the congregation in worship through the Children's message, then are led to Room 101 and our "mini theater" room for the weekly topic lesson. "HOLY MOLY" is our curriculum theme this year! We believe our children are blessings, and we want them to grow in our love and the love of God. The children's table is set up in the Parlor for activity if desired for those who choose to remain during worship with parent supervision for any children not participating in regular faith formation activities. "Kids Busy Bags" are also available at the welcome table.

UPDATE TO PARENTS FOR COMMUNION SUNDAYS.

On the first Sunday of the month when the congregation celebrates the sacrament of Holy Communion, children who normally participate in "Holy Moly" Faith Formation are invited to a brief craft time with leaders, then returning or may remain in the sanctuary with their family in worship. We know some parents welcome their children participating in the sacrament. Others want their children to wait until they are confirmed or until they have a stronger understanding of the meaning of this sacred meal of love and grace.

At St. John's UCC, Fullerton, we observe an OPEN Communion Table, which means that ALL PERSONS, regardless of age or full understanding of the sacrament, are welcome to receive. After all, how many of us as adults in our faith can fully express or explain the significance of this sacred meal. Children will return or stay with their parents on the first Sunday of the month to accommodate their participation in Holy Communion, as those who observe in participation, or as those who receive in participation. We have both wine and grape juice in the trays to meet the needs of all.

9:30am Morning Worship - Our faith community gathers to Worship, Love and Serve every Sunday morning! We have a place for you, one and all, and YOU ARE... WELCOME HERE! We have created places in the congregational seating for those with mobility issues and assistance support. We are working to make our spaces and worship experience more accessible for everyone, including those with hearing impairment.

Join us each week in the gathering spaces, the classrooms, the sanctuary, online, and with Sunday Social time following worship in Fox Hall. We welcome you into the experience of God's love through St. John's. 11:00am Confirmation Class for 7th & 8th Graders - Youth Room (3rd Floor)

AFFIRMING FAITH

We are in the final month of classes and activities for our Confirmation Class, who will be received in worship on June 1. ALL YOUTH are welcome to come to the youth room during our class time and share with our Confirmation Class as we grow in your faith.

Whitehall Food Pantry

If you've been thinking about volunteering at the food pantry or if you are curious about the work being done there, we invite you to come visit us to see what the pantry is all about. Our church volunteers meet at St. Stephen's Episcopal Church located at 3900 Mechanicsville Rd. in Whitehall on the 4th Monday of each month.

At the morning session (9 am – 11 am) donated food arrives from Giant, Weis, Redner's, Chick-Fil-A, and from local churches in the area. About 50 % of the food supplies, which the pantry pays for, comes from Second Harvest Food Bank. The food, which consists of canned goods, fresh produce, breads, and baked goods, is then sorted and placed on shelves and tables. Meats, prepared foods, and dairy products are sorted and placed in refrigerators and freezers until the evening.

At the evening session (5:30 pm – 7:30 pm), the patrons who come are assigned to one of our volunteers called "cart masters." They will take a grocery cart and accompany each patron to assist in the food-selection process, help bag the items, and load their cars. Other volunteers assist the patrons with choices of perishable food items that are available.

For the month of May, we are continuing to collect pancake mix, jelly, and coffee. Any other non-perishable food items are always welcome. A shopping cart can be found in the coat-room area by the sanctuary where you can place your donations. Monetary contributions are always accepted and can be forwarded to the church office, placed in the offering plate, or given online or by text.

Quinn Family California Wildfires Update

Our former Visitation Pastor, Rev. David Quinn, reported on Facebook that his family was affected by the California wildfires at the beginning of the year. Pastor Dave's son Ben and daughter-in-law Jennie were renting a house in Altadena, California, a little town north of Los Angeles on the edge of the San Gabriel Mountains.



As Pastor Dave wrote, "One Tuesday night back in January, high winds were driving the wildfires down the mountains. They were told they had an hour to evacuate. They threw what they could in the car and drove off. The fire went through their neighborhood like a blowtorch. All that was left behind was incinerated. Now they have come to Bethlehem and are staying with a friend and working on rebuilding their lives. What have they lost? Everything, almost. What do they still have? People who care."

Over the last several weeks we have been asking for monetary donations to help Pastor Dave's family recover from the wildfires. As this newsletter goes to press, we have collected \$900.00 because of your generosity. We are grateful for your acts of kindness and for your many prayers.

Update on Other Mission Outreaches

Thank you to everyone who contributed to UCC National's special offering "One Great Hour of Sharing." A total of \$340.00 was received. OGHS helps those impacted by poverty, hunger, sickness, conflict, emergencies, and natural disasters worldwide.
