Dear Beloved Community of St. John's UCC, Fullerton,

Summer has arrived, and with it, the unmistakable rhythm of longer days, family vacations, camping, cookouts, and neighborhood walks that stretch into the evening. For many, this season offers a change of pace and a welcome breather. Here in the life of our church, summer doesn't mean stepping away from ministry, it simply means we get to live it out in fresh and vibrant ways. While we "take a break" from some activities, we offer other new opportunities for us to make connections in faith.

Our calendar is full of meaningful opportunities to grow in faith, connect in fellowship, and serve with joy. Please join us in welcoming Samantha Kistler, who will be joining our program ministry team as a quarter-time staff member. Persons in seminary who are "members in discernment" (MiDs) are required to have a Field Education Placement during their final year. Samantha brings a wealth of interest and experience to St. John's as she completes her training. We will be part of her spiritual and professional development, and then

intend to expand that experience with a second year of part-time ministry.

Part of Samantha's training includes specific focus on our ministry with children and youth. She will also share in some visitation to our homebound members and some hospital care. Sunday worship leadership will be part of the overall experience of her placement experience. We will share a much more in-depth introduction of Samantha in our August Connections newsletter, along with more details about her background, hopes and interests in ministry. Until then, please join the congregation now in praying for Samantha, her husband and daughters, and the next steps we will take together as we grow our Faith Formation ministry. Their gifts and passion for walking alongside children and young people, and our seasoned saints will help us build even stronger foundations of faith, imagination, and belonging for the coming program year and beyond.

#### **Good News From The Consistory**

With the recommendation of the Personnel Committee leaders, the endorsement of the Stewardship and Finance Committee, and approval of the Consistory, St. John's will step forward in faith, welcoming the beginning of a new day in our ministry. Starting in August 2025, Samantha Kistler, a young woman who is a Member in Discernment, working to complete seminary at Moravian University and further explore her calling to ministry, will complete her Field Education Placement and further discern how God would have her serve in ministry, working with us at St. John's.. The Elders of our Spiritual Council, the Consistory leadership and the Sr. Pastor have all visited with Samantha and believe God is opening a tremendous opportunity for us to grow our ministry and help Samantha discern her calling.

Together, WE - The St. John's Congregation will:

1) provide a stipend to support Samantha's travel and honor her work with us (August 2025 through June 2026). Samantha plans to continue ministry for a second year with us after her seminary education is complete and she is approved for ordination.

In the first year of Field Education, Samantha would be required to spend 8-10 hours per week in various ministries at St. John's, to include Visitation and Congregational Care, creating enriching experiences in Faith Formation for children and youth, and sharing in worship leadership.

2) provide a ministry support loop in addition to pastoral supervision, to help Samantha have the best ministry experience and growth possible in her discernment.

In a second year of ministry, Samantha's time with us would increase. The Stewardship and Finance Committee and Sr. Pastor are exploring more detailed descriptions of what a second year of ministry partnership might look like. Samantha shared her intention to remain in bi-vocational ministry while continuing her current full time employment as an Emotional Support Teacher for the Lehighton High School. This would enable her to continue to have other employment

benefits such as healthcare, which we currently cannot provide.

The Elders and Consistory are excited to share our belief that a two-year commitment to partnered ministry is the best path forward for St. John's, especially as we nurture ministry with families and our homebound community. One year simply isn't enough to reestablish strong leadership and build the kind of meaningful ministry we envision together. We want to invest in a partnership that fosters growth, continuity, and care, for Samantha and for our whole congregation.

With the encouragement of the Consistory, the Stewardship and Finance Committee and our Senior Pastor are exploring the use of some of our self-restricted funds to help make this second year possible. We are hopeful that, with anticipated support from two additional funding sources and the continued generosity of the St. John's family, we will meet this goal. We truly believe God is calling us to steward our resources in ways that grow our program ministry, strengthen our pastoral care, and support the sacred beginning of a faithful ministry career.

# OUTDOOR WORSHIP AT THE ST. JOHN'S PAVILION SAVE THE DATES - July 27 and August 31



#### Thank You To Rev. Becca Stephens

The following report was shared by an incredible leader and pastor with a serving heart, our own Rev. Becca Stephens. Over the last several years, Becca has VOLUNTEERED her time and talents serve our children, youth and parents, guiding our Faith Formation activities for children and confirmation activities. She has partnered with parents, volunteers, helpers and a new Senior Pastor to create experiences in faith that would be meaningful and help St. John's when pandemic and finances made it impossible to have a paid staff person.

We invite you to read her final report to the Consistory for our June meeting. At the start of our Program Year in September, we want to honor Becca and recognize her in worship for her generosity and "No Matter What" spirit to serve with the love of Christ.

#### **FAITH FORMATION**

I have ended my time as the coordinator of the Sunday morning children's Faith Formation Program as of Sunday May 25. At our in-person meeting on Monday May 12 the following people were present: Donnalee Yeatts, Wendy Fox, Constance Arnold all of who will be classroom leaders in the fall. Susan Rarich & Michelle Gutekunst, who will serve as classroom helpers & Jenn Rarich who will help on occasion as she is able. Amy Feidler was also in attendance and will continue to serve as craft consultant for the program. Staci Pagan will also be a classroom helper in the fall but was unable to attend the meeting.

We discussed the details of using the Holy Moly digital curriculum, DonnaLee took notes and leaders and helpers will be meeting sometime after Vacation Bible School to make specific decisions about leadership for the Sunday morning children's Faith Formation program going forward.

I stepped up in the fall of 2021, when we were between pastors, to coordinate the confirmation class, under the guidance of the Confirmation Task Force and with Linda Powell and Wayne Lichtenwalner as my classroom assistants. After Pastor Steve was elected in the fall of 2021, I continued with the confirmation class as he was getting settled in. Together we confirmed 14 young people in May of 2022.

Sometime during the interim period we formed a Faith Formation Task Force to revitalize our Children's Faith Formation Program which was no longer operational as a result of the pandemic. Pastor Steve joined the Task Force soon after he began. In the summer of 2022 I proposed to Pastor Steve that I have a conversation with Rev Cecilia Baxter who at the time was coordinating Children's Faith Formation at New Creation UCC in Easton After consulting with Cecilia I offered to take the lead to provide programing for the young children at St John's who at the time were ranging in age from 3-7. We officially began in earnest in September of 2022.

September of 2024 marked a turning point for the program, as the approach that had worked when the children were younger was less effective as some of them were now as old as 8 & 9 and seemed to be losing interest in what was admittedly geared to younger children. Last summer I was on a mission to find a Bible-based curriculum with a video component that would be engaging for children as young as kindergarten and as old as 5th grade. After extensive research, I settled on The Holy Moly curriculum which has worked quite well during this past year. As the program is online rather than hard copies there were many details that needed to be worked out to make effective use of the program materials, including the logistics of projecting in our mini theatre the video coordinated with the lesson for each Sunday.

Over the course of three years I have worked with leaders and helpers alike and was happy to provide one on one training as a way of developing new leaders.

I have enjoyed my time with the children and adults alike and am grateful for the ways my leadership has been accepted. And now, four years later, it is time for me to step aside to give others the opportunity to develop their leadership skills.


