"The Christmas Journey"

We all love a good story. Some of them stick with us and we love to hear them again and again. We bask in the familiar and nostalgic. We take delight in the nuance, the details which give us opportunities to place ourselves within these stories.

Several years ago I received a book by Donna VanLiere, bestselling author of The Christmas Shoes and The Christmas Hope. The new book shares the journey of Joseph and Mary from Nazareth to Bethlehem. The author writes, "The eighty-mile journey of a common carpenter and a simple peasant girl is one of the most enduring stories in history. As books go out of print and stories fade from memory, the journey of Joseph and Mary and her delivery inside a common barn continue to bless and inspire hope in people around the world."



The story of the Nativity is alive in our modern world. We share the journey year after year as our own reminder that the journey which began more than 2000 years ago is still the most powerful series of events ever to touch the minds and hearts of people everywhere. The story is almost too familiar to us. We've conflated some other stories and actors into the sacred story. The greeting card companies and movie producers have painted quite the picture for us over the years. Somewhere along the way the cave have been cleaned up, the birth became painless, and the people involved were stripped of the fear and very real consequences of this birth. It seems we have conveniently forgotten much of what happened to make the journey possible.

Perhaps this Advent season, we too can be reminded of the anticipation, the concern, the struggle against the social stigma and family shame. Perhaps we too will recognize that they are required to make this journey. They didn't choose it. It was decreed that ALL should be recorded. This Advent, even if we find ourselves a bit hesitant or even reluctant, will we find "the reason for the season?" Will we make the journey into a familiar place with eyes open to the possibilities of what God might be preparing for us to do? Will we see how much is required of us as well, not in gift giving and pleasantries, but in coming to the manger as did the shepherds, to see this thing that had been made known to them? Will we come, knowing the demands on our lives to follow this Christ Child? to keep the couple safe? to protect the Child? to be sure his influence isn't just a noted story, but a living presence in our lives?

As we make "The Christmas Journey" for ourselves, may the anticipation of Christ's coming cause us to prepare our lives in new ways to not only experience what God is doing, but to participate in God's purposes for us and all the world. May we be ushered in to the fresh experience of the One who is born for us, who is God with us! And in our Christmas journey, may we be rooted in the love and life of our gracious, still speaking, still creating God. May we choose to love God, love our neighbors and love ourselves in our journey of faith. We are St. John's UCC, Fullerton, and...


We jubilate the precious advent of trust. We shout with glorious tongues at the coming of hope. All the earth's tribes loosen their voices To celebrate the promise of Peace.

for Children, Youth & Adults & Worship Celebrations!

Here's what we have to look forward to as we engage in faith formation and worship together.

8:30am Adult Faith Formation - The Friendship Sunday School Class meets in Rm 201, to accommodate those with physical mobility needs. All are welcome to topical studies, biblical reflection and group discussion, led by various class members. Anyone needing assistance, please use the Grape Street elevator entrance and come to the sanctuary level. There's always great conversation and some tasty treats to start your Sunday morning well! Contact Tom and Emilie Moyer for more information.

9:30am Children's Faith Formation - Children gather with the congregation in worship through the Children's message, then are let to Room 101 and our "mini theater" room for the weekly topic lesson. "HOLY MOLY" is our curriculum theme this year! We believe our children are blessings, and we want them to grow in our love and the love of God. The children's table is set up in the Parlor for activity if desired for those who choose to remain during worship with parent supervision for any children not participating in regular faith formation activities. "Kids Busy Bags" are also available at the welcome table.

Parents... We have a new priority for children on Communion Sundays.

Children who attend "Holy Moly" on the 1st Sunday of the month when the congregation celebrates the sacrament of Holy Communion will be brough back to the sanctuary to join their family in worship. We know some parents welcome their children participating in the sacrament. Others want their children to wait until they're confirmed or until they have a stronger understanding of the meaning of this sacred meal of love and grace.

As St. John's UCC, Fullerton, we observe an OPEN Communion Table, which means that ALL PERSONS, regardless of age or full understanding of the sacrament, are welcome to receive. After all, how many of us as adults in our faith can fully express or explain the significance of this sacred meal.

Children will have an abbreviated lesson on the first Sunday of the month to accommodate their participation in Holy Communion, as those who observe in participation or as those who receive in participation. We have both wine and grape juice in the trays to meet the needs of all.

9:10-9:25 Expanding Hospitality with Pre-Service Beverages - During the season of Advent, Christmas and into the winter months of 2025, we want to welcome our worship participants with a warm beverage option BEFORE worship as well as our Sunday Social time following worship. As you arrive during this season, come enjoy a cup of coffee, hot tea or hot chocolate! Water will be available as always. Come to worship and let your body be warmed in our fellowship and friendship together.

9:30am Morning Worship - Our faith community gathers to Worship, Love and Serve every Sunday morning! We have a place for you, one and all, and YOU ARE... WELCOME HERE! We have created places in the congregational seating for those with mobility issues and assistance support. We are working to make our spaces and worship experience more accessible for everyone, including those with hearing impairment.

Join us each week in the gathering spaces, the classrooms, the sanctuary, online, and with Sunday Social time following worship in Fox Hall. We welcome you in to the experience of God's love through St. John's.

11am Confirmation Class for 7th & 8th Graders - Affirming Faith through Confirmation Class held in the third-floor Youth Room.

Confirmation Class participants will be visiting with you during our Sunday Social time. Please look for Nicholas Santee, Aiden Hannis and Lucas Williams in the minutes before we move to our class sessions each week, or on 4th Sundays when they generally have more time to connect with the congregation. Express your thanks for their worship participation and leadership. Join them in the journey of discovery to affirm their faith in God through Jesus Christ.

Confirmation sessions continue through the end of May with class lessons, worship experiences, service projects, church life, and learning with friends, leaders and mentors. These young men will look to YOU, the people of St. John's, to model what faith looks like. They will witness how you WORSHIP, LOVE and SERVE to create your own "No Matter What" kind of faith. What we live before them matters every single day!

As we make this Affirming Faith journey together, you are invited to pray for them by name, to share your encouragement with them. Get to know these guys and help them know who we are and how our lives have been changed in the love of God.

ALL YOUTH are welcome to come to the youth room during our Sunday Social time and share with our Confirmation Class as well as spend time with other youth and grow in your faith.

Family Fun & Movie Night - Just in Time for Christmas

DECEMBER 1

First Sunday of Advent with Holy Communion - HOPE Jeremiah 33:14-16, Psalm 25:1-10, 1 Thessalonians 3:9-13, Luke 21:25-36 HOPE - Christmas Chronicles (2018)

This story of sister and brother, Kate and Teddy Pierce, shares the Christmas Eve plan to catch Santa Claus on camera. It turns into an unexpected journey that most kids could only dream about. What are we hoping to experience in this season of anticipation? Do we

long for relationships to be renewed? Do we want some focus and light to brighten our days? Is there something that we wish we could experience again or perhaps for the first time that would inspire us? Come experience hope with us!

DECEMBER 7

(Saturday, 6pm) - Join us in Fox Hall for Soup and the film **The Polar Express (2004)**

Our Advent movie is Polar Express and those searching to know the real presence of the Christmas and have assurance that they still hear the timeless gift, whether child or adult. candle, and on his way home he sees new things in the candlelight. See how a coldhearted man can change suddenly in light of Christmas. A cherished fable about love and charity.

Just weeks apart in September and into October, two powerful hurricanes battered southeastern United States, causing widespread devastation and impacting countless lives and communities. Over 250 people have perished; towns, homes, and businesses were destroyed; roads and bridges were wiped out; and people were left without shelter, water and electricity.









In response to this disaster, UCC Disaster Ministries and Church World Service mobilized to provide immediate and long-term support to those affected. Our church has mobilized too. The Mission Committee and our new Confirmation Class are committed to helping others who have been affected by this disaster, and we need your help.

Three other churches (Christ UCC Lowhill, Good Shepherd UCC in Boyertown, and St. John's ECLA in Whitehall) are partnering with us by collecting specific items for CWS's Emergency Cleanup Bucket Kits. Our commitment at St. John's is to collect the following items:

• 5-gallon clean-up bucket with resealable lid (if used, please scrub clean). No buckets that held chemicals of any kind. No screw lid.

- Scrub brush with or without a handle.
- 6-9 oz. bottle of non-aerosol insect repellent. Pump spray bottles must have protective covers. Packs of 10-20 insect repellent wipes are also acceptable.
- Two pairs of heavy-duty, waterproof dishwashing gloves.
 Latex-free, non-surgical. Durable for multiple use.

Donated items can be placed in the basket and on the table in the coatroom area by the sanctuary.

Update on Other Outreaches

A total of \$1,365.00 was received. CROP Hunger Walks have become community-based events held in cities across the United States, raising dollars to support the global mission of Church World Service to eradicate hunger and poverty. Twenty-five percent of the funds raised stay within our local community to support the Ecumenical Food Bank and the Lehigh Conference of Churches' Conference Kitchen.
