



2024 Chief Manuelito Scholarship Awards Ceremony

Congratulations on earning the prestigious Chief Manuelito Scholarship. In preparation for the 2024 Chief Manuelito Awards Ceremony, we ask each scholar to submit a vertical, high-resolution photograph for use in online and print media. In past years, the Office of Navajo Nation Scholarship & Financial Assistance (ONNSFA) published a full-page advertisement in the *Navajo Times* (an example is included in this packet).

If you choose to have your photo published in online and print media, please submit a vertical, high-resolution photo of yourself adhering to the following standards:

- Refrain from wearing clothing that displays sayings, brands, logos, etc. For your background, we suggest using a blank wall or uncluttered outdoor space.
- Do not digitally alter the photograph or include props in your photo. i.e. No SnapChat, Instagram, or Facetune filters.
- Do not submit “professional” portraits unless written permission from the photographer is included. Letters that state “personal use” will not qualify, as your photos will be used online and published in the Navajo Times.

What should I wear?

- Avoid busy prints and small patterns.
- Plain colors show up best.

How should I pose? You have a few options:

- A photo that includes your head, neck, and shoulders - a headshot, works great.
- You can also use a photo that shows you from the waist up.
- Avoid including others, group shots, or large props.

Where should the photo be taken?

- Anywhere that is appropriate and represents you.
- Keep the background simple; plain colors work well.
- Be sure there’s enough light - outside facing away from the sun or inside with ample light or using one of the portrait modes on your camera.

What kind of camera do I need?

- Standard resolution, smartphone camera quality or higher, vertical orientation.
- Make sure your image is sharp and focused. Blurry photos will not be accepted.

What file type should I submit?

- PNG or JPEG
- No iPhone "Live" photos

What else do I need to know?

- All photos are subject to review/removal.
- You will be asked to sign a photo release allowing the ONNSFA to copyright, use, and publish your photo for such purposes as publicity, illustration, and advertising. Parents of scholars under the age of 18 also will be requested to sign the photo release.

What if I don't send in a photo?

- You will not be featured in the full-page advertisement if not submitted by the **July 24, 2024**, deadline.

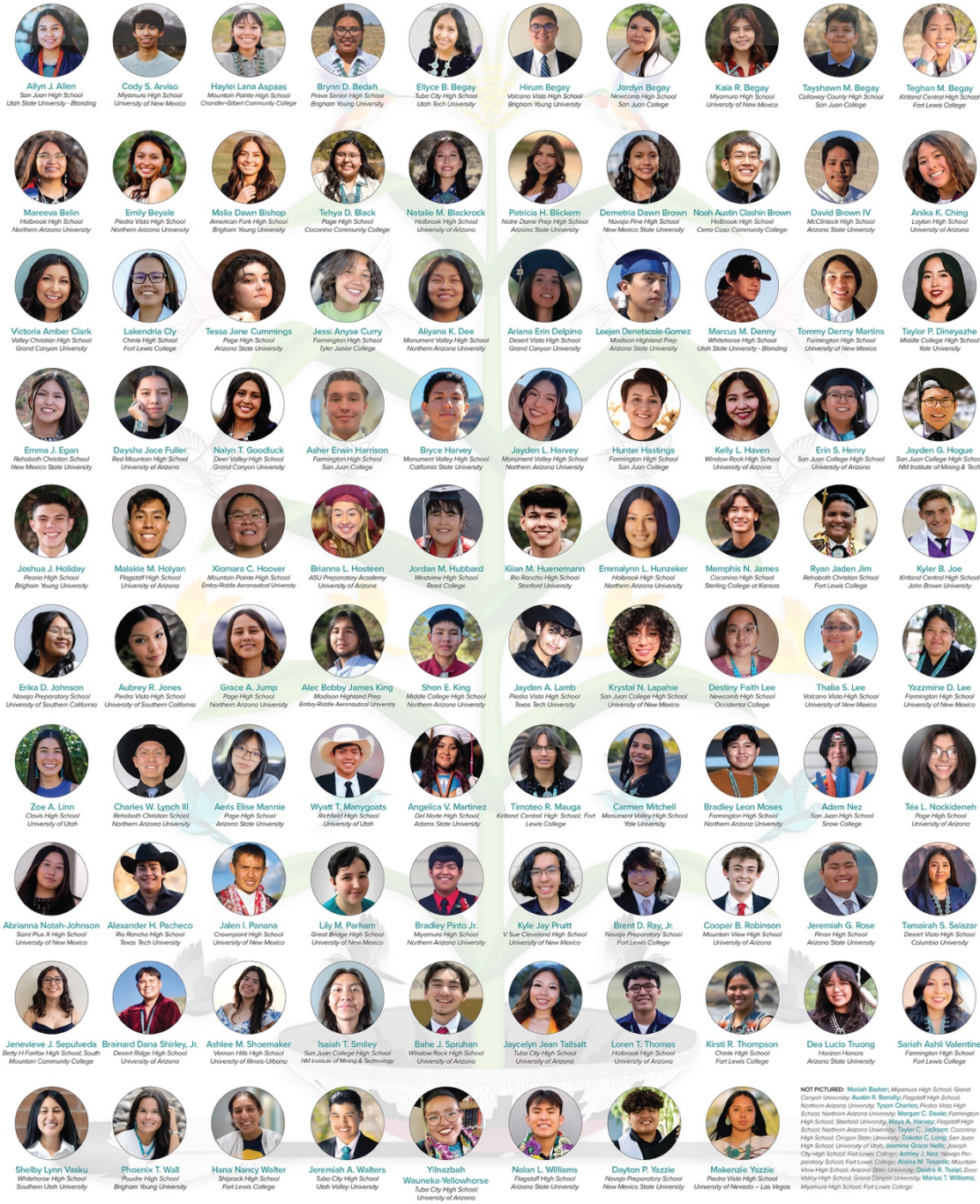
Who do I submit my photo to?

Honoring Hastiin Chi'ihajjin's Legacy

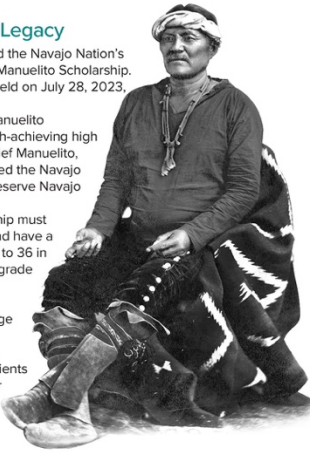
One hundred ten graduating seniors earned the Navajo Nation's highest academic award in 2023 – the Chief Manuelito Scholarship. They were honored at an awards ceremony held on July 28, 2023, at Twin Arrows Navajo Casino Resort.

The Navajo Nation established the Chief Manuelito Scholarship program in 1980 to recognize high-achieving high school graduates. The scholarship honors Chief Manuelito, Hastiin Chi'ihajjin (1818-1893), who encouraged the Navajo people to seek education and protect and preserve Navajo tradition and culture.

Students seeking eligibility for the scholarship must be admitted to a post-secondary institution and have a minimum ACT score of anywhere between 21 to 36 in combination with a proportionate cumulative grade point average.

Students must complete courses in Navajo Language (1 unit high school credit or 1+ college credit) and Navajo Government (.5 unit high school credit or 1+ college credit) before high school graduation. To maintain eligibility, recipients must earn a 3.0 GPA and 12 or more semester credit hours per academic term.
