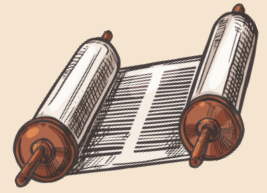

Suddenly, the wind shifts... and you know you've been chosen.

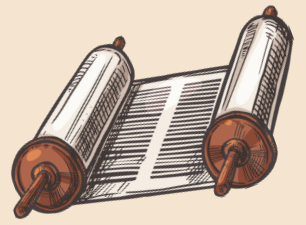
Branches of Inspiration:

Try This Sentence Starter:

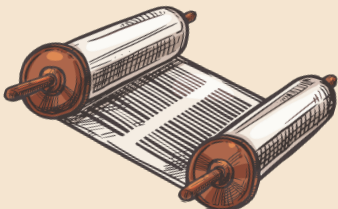
"I held the scroll in my hands, and Ollie gave me a look that said... it's time."

Teacher's Companion Guide

For: Ollie's Secret Scroll – A Storytelling Adventure

Overview:

This activity invites students to engage with a whimsical prompt centered around Ollie the Owl and a mysterious scroll. Designed to nurture imagination, character development, and narrative structure, the story begins with a discovery and evolves based on each child's creative choices.

Learning Objectives:

- Encourage creative writing through storytelling prompts.

Tips for Classroom Use:

- Use the included worksheet as a center activity, early finisher task, or creative writing lesson.

- Display Brave Storyteller Badges to celebrate each student's effort and imagination!
