Theme: Silly animal fun End Words: school, tail, roar, swim, snack, giggle


It started like a normal day at school, until I saw a monkey chase its tail!

So now our school has learned to roar, to snack, to swim, and yes — to giggle. But only if you promise not to pull a tail.


What is a sestina?



A sestina is a poem with six stanzas of six lines each. The trick is to use the same six words at the end of each line in a special order!




The Sestina Pattern
