The Morning Scriptures Sylvester Baptiste

Our first reading is from the book of Psalms, number 25 verses 1-10

In you, LORD my God, I put my trust. I trust in you; do not let me be put to shame, nor let my enemies triumph over me. No one who hopes in you will ever be put to shame, but shame will come on those who are treacherous without cause. Show me your ways, LORD, teach me your paths. Guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my Savior, and my hope is in you all day long. Remember, LORD, your great mercy and love, for they are from of old. Do not remember the sins of my youth, and my rebellious ways; according to your love remember me, for

you, LORD, are good. Good and upright is the LORD; therefore he instructs sinners in his ways. He guides the humble in what is right and teaches them his way. All the ways of the LORD are loving and faithful toward those who keep the demands of his covenant.

Our second reading is the second letter of Peter, chapter 3, verses 18-22

For Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God. He was put to death in the body but made alive in the Spirit. After being made alive, he went and made proclamation to the imprisoned spirits—to those who were disobedient long ago when God waited patiently in the days of Noah while the ark was being built. In it only a few people, eight in all, were saved through water, and this water symbolizes baptism that now saves you also—not the removal of dirt from the body but the pledge of a clear conscience toward God. It saves you by the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at God's right hand—with angels, authorities and powers in submission to him.

*Will you rise (if able) for the reading of the Gospel, from John 9:1-12

As he went along, he saw a man blind from birth. His disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" "Neither this man nor his parents sinned," said Jesus, "but this happened so that the works of God might be displayed in him. As long as it is day, we must do the works of him who sent me. Night is coming, when no one can work. While I am in the world, I am the light of the world." After saying this, he spit on the ground, made some mud with the saliva, and put

it on the man's eyes. "Go," he told him, "wash in the Pool of Siloam" So the man went and washed, and came home seeing. His neighbors and those who had formerly seen him begging asked, "Isn't this the same man who used to sit and beg?" Some claimed that he was. Others

said, "No, he only looks like him." But he himself insisted, "I am the man." "How then were your eyes opened?" they asked. He replied, "The man they call Jesus made some mud and put it on my eyes. He told me to go to Siloam and wash. So I went and washed, and then I could see."

Dear Friends,

I have just read an article in a magazine, entitled. "The Black Church: A Story of Grace and Survival" highlighting the spiritual elements Black people carried with them from Africa. Within the article is also the background work the historian Dr. Louis Gates did for a four-hour television special called "This is Our Story, This is our Song." LeeAnne and I have watched the first segment, and are ready to watch the second.

To produce this film Gates interviewed 62 people including Oprah Winfrey, Bishop Michael Curry, John Legend, Al Sharpton, Scholar Cornel West, Shirley Caesar, Yolanda Adams, and many more.

Its inspirational, to say the least. Not only is the commentary heartening, but the music is amazing! This is not Gates' first film (he's done 22 others, but don't miss this one). You will see it advertised both on radio and television.

The point that Gates wants to make I this film is that "the process of religious formation in America was not a break from the African past. The spiritual elements Black people carried with them from Africa provided the foundation for what would become Black Christianity."

Viewing Gates' film is a perfect way to celebrate Black history Month.
