Our first reading is from the book of Psalms 22:23-31

From you comes the theme of my praise in the great assembly; before those who fear

You I will fulfill my vows. The poor will eat and be satisfied; those who seek the LORD will praise him— may your hearts live forever! All the ends of the earth will remember and turn to the LORD, and all the families of the nations will bow down before him, for dominion belongs to the LORD and he rules over the nations. All the rich of the earth will feast and worship; all who go down to the dust will kneel before him — those who cannot keep themselves alive. Posterity will serve him; future generations will be told about the Lord. They will proclaim his righteousness, declaring to a people yet unborn: He has done it!

But, as you will see, meeting Jesus was a new experience every time anyone encountered him. As we share those encounters, we hope they will encourage your relationship with Jesus Christ.

From My Heart To Yours... Dear Friends,

This past week we reached a startling, disappointing, and unimaginable number of deaths attributed to the covid 19 pandemic.

Many have probably become numb to this reality that has been advertised daily on network news.

On our weekly clergy call with our District Superintendent, colleagues shared some stories about how these deaths have affected their parishes, either because members of their congregations are counted in those numbers, or others whose families are among them. The sorrow and grief has been compounded with dramatic expressions of loss, when death has come to their loved ones without them.

Remarkably, there have been front-line nurses and doctors who have stood in for them. Don't miss this...try to imagine what people have gone through to have been thankful for those instances in which someone stood in for them, when their loved one passed. And then, imagine how others felt when they realized that no one was with them when they passed.

500,000 souls! That number is greater than most towns and cities of our country. In fact it's a milestone so large that the number of Americans who have died compared to just two other events in U.S. history: the 1918 Spanish influenza pandemic (675,000 lives lost) and the Civil War (between 618,000 - 750,000 lives).

What I have been thankful for is that most TV networks have put names to at least a few of those who have died. I watch and listen to their stories and say a prayer for their loved ones. By doing so, we inherit part of the liberated souls of those lost, and in a very real way we become richer in their humanness.
