This Morning's Scriptural Texts

Deuteronomy 18:17-20

The LORD said to me: "What they say is good. I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their fellow Israelites, and I will put my words in his mouth. He will tell them everything I command him. I myself will call to account anyone who does not listen to my words that the prophet speaks in my name. But a prophet who presumes to speak in my name anything I have not commanded, or a prophet who speaks in the name of other gods, is to be put to death.

Luke 2:41-52

Every year Jesus' parents went to Jerusalem for the Festival of the Passover. When he was twelve years old, they went up to the festival, according to the custom. After the festival was over, while his parents were returning home, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem, but they were unaware of it. Thinking he was in their company, they traveled on for a day. Then they began looking for him among their relatives and friends. When they did not find him, they went back to Jerusalem to look for him. After three days they found him in the temple courts, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. Everyone who heard him was amazed at his understanding and his answers. When his parents saw him, they were astonished. His mother said to him, "Son, why have you treated us like this? Your father and I have been anxiously searching for you." "Why were you searching for me?" he asked. "Didn't you know I had to be in my Father's house?" But they did not understand what he was saying to them. Then he went down to Nazareth with them and was obedient to them. But his mother treasured all these things in her heart. And Jesus grew in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and man.

From My Heart To Yours...

Dear Friends,

This is the time of the year we all make promises to ourselves for the new year, promises that we have every intention to keep.

I have had a book in my library for years, it's appeal keeps me returning to it every so often. It was written by Dr. Martin Marty, who was a professor of Church History and regular contributor of Christian Century magazine for years. The book's title is, "You Are Promise." Few people speak that way. We say "You are promising," or "You show promise." You might remember the song "You Are Love?" It says a lot more than "You are loving," or "you are capable of love." It says that the loved one embodies all that the word means.

You might say, "You are grace," but would more often say "You are graceful." These kind of phrases are rarely used because, perhaps, we have not found people that really live up to them.

Just so with "You are Promise." To be *promising* is not enough. Behind the word promise are the Latin words, *pro mission*. They mean "sent forth." As far as God is concerned scripture suggests that we are in the world for a "mission." We are "pro-missio" people sent forth to the world. We embody God's idea of promise. Your being here makes a difference, to God and to Christ. You embody promise, embodying all that the word means. Think about when you are making up your list of new year promises.
