The Morning Scriptures – please be seated

A Reading from the prophecy of Isaiah chapter 43: 1-7

Is but now, this is what the LORD says— he who created you, Jacob, he who formed you, Israel: “Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you. When you walk through the fire, you will not be burned; the flames will not set you ablaze. For I am the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior; I give Egypt for your ransom, Cush¹ and Seba in your stead. Since you are precious and honored in my sight, and because I love you, I will give people in exchange for you, nations in exchange for your life.

Do not be afraid, for I am with you; I will bring your children from the east and gather you from the west. I will say to the north, 'Give them up!' and to the south, 'Do not hold them back.' Bring my sons from afar and my daughters from the ends of the earth— everyone who is called by my name, whom I created for my glory, whom I formed and made.

A reading from the Gospel of Luke 3:15-17, 21-22

The people were waiting expectantly and were all wondering in their hearts if one might possibly be the Messiah. John answered them all, "I baptize you with ^[a] water. But one who is more powerful than I will come, the straps of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptize you with ^[b] the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fork is in his hand to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but he will burn up the chaff with unquenchable fire." When all the people were being baptized, Jesus was baptized too. And as he was praying, heaven was opened and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased."

Dear Friends,

When I was serving a church in Iowa, my Associate Minister, Richard Miller-Todd was asked to baptize a baby born to a couple with whom he was close friends. Richard had a wonderful sense of humor, so I did not hesitate to put a live gold fish in the baptismal font to help him relax at his first infant baptism.

When the couple, Richard, the god-parents, and an attending Deaconess stood around the font, the Deaconess ceremoniously removed the cover of the font to find the gold fish I had placed there just before the service began, swimming about! As each of them standing around the font became aware of the gold fish, smiles broke out, which encouraged the baby to smile as well. Perfect timing.

Richard was quick to comment. "As you all know, in early Christianity the secret sign of being a Christian was a fish. It appears this child about to be baptized is being doubly blessed by water and a fish. And, she is aglow!

Today's New Testament is about the baptism of Jesus by John. We are told that a voice came from heaven as Jesus was baptized. "This is my son, in whom I am well-pleased." The Holy Spirit descended upon Jesus. I rather think something similar happened during that baptism in Iowa. This was God's child, named and consecrated to the Almighty.
