

Leader: Remember the wonders he has done



#### Matthew 20:1-16

For the kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire workers for his vineyard. He agreed to pay them a denarius<sup>[a]</sup> for the day and sent them into his vineyard. "About nine in the morning he went out and saw others standing in the marketplace doing nothing. He told them, 'You also go and work in my vineyard, and I will pay you whatever is right.' So they went. "He went out again about noon and about three in the afternoon and did the same thing. About five in the afternoon he went out and found still others standing around. He asked them, 'Why have you been standing here all day long doing nothing?' "Because no one has hired us,' they answered. "He said to them, 'You also go and work in my vineyard.' "When evening came, the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, 'Call the workers and pay them their wages, beginning with the last ones hired and going on to the first.' "The workers who were hired about five in the afternoon came and each received a denarius. So when those came who were hired first, they expected to receive more. But each one of them also received a denarius. When they received it, they began to grumble against the landowner. 'These who were hired last worked only one hour,' they said, 'and you have made them equal to us who have borne the burden of the work and the heat of the day.' "But he answered one of them, 'I am not being unfair to you, friend. Didn't you agree to work for a denarius? Take your pay and go. I want to give the one who was hired last the same as I gave you. Don't I have the right to do what I want with my own money? Or are you envious because I am generous?' "So the last will be first, and the first will be last."

#### From My Heart To Yours...

Dear Friends,

For those people who have worked for most if not all their lives for hourly wages, the parable of the workers is one that would surely raise one's blood pressure.

While serving a church in Southern California, we had three of four occasions when we needed extra, strong hands to move furniture from one part of the campus to another, or clean out a flooded basement in one of the buildings, or set up tents for our annual fair, etc. Timing was critical because the campus that was busy 7 days and nights a week. Our custodian said he would hire the men needed. When I asked where he would find them he said "the parking lot of Home Depot." I had never experienced anything like it. Within a half hour he had brought four or five men to the campus to help anywhere from 2-4 hours.

I was told that many of these men were either in the process of applying for work visas, citizenship applicants, or looking for a second or third income to support their families. When the project was done, we paid them according to the numbers of hours they had worked. You work for 2 hours. you are paid (and I made sure they were paid a fair wage, instead of the wage suggested to me) for two hours.

That seemingly "fair" trade was not what the farmer in the parable had in mind. He paid all of them as if they had all worked the same hours

We need to remember that we are talking about God's goodness - God's kindness, God's extravagance. It is Matthew's idea of a God who tuns the world upside down with God's "last, first, first last plan for humankind. As far as our Lord is concerned, love is extravagant, non-discriminatory, and fair. The plan for building God's

commonwealth is very different from our own...thank God.
