I needed my wife to feel reassured and protected, so our marriage thrived.

Thus, I worked through my stuff with Godly counsel, exercise, and education. I developed new brain patterns, as well as positive conflict resolution and communication skills.

Today, my relationships with my wife, children, parents, siblings, and extended family are better than ever. I know this is because of my stubbornness to live by the rule of "No More Curse." Generational curses can be eliminated at any moment and by any person with help. This Father's Day, I am speaking to men struggling because of mistakes they believe can't be overcome. None of you are alone. None of you are broken. You all have the potential to turn things around. If you are a believer, come to your knees and ask for forgiveness. a new heart, and start the road of repentance. To the rest of you men, there's hope and help. Seek counseling, men's affinity groups, exercise, and meditation. And yes, prayer is for you too.
