



ABOUT YOUR SESSION

Plan to spend about 1-2 hours with me the day of your photo shoot. I ask that each high school student be accompanied by one adult. This person may be asked to help move about the location, carrying props and outfit changes as well as being asked to hold lighting equipment when necessary. If traveling to more than one location, please note you will need to drive separately. Payment in the form of cash or check is due the day of your session.

WHAT TO BRING

- TWO outfit changes are included with your session. For additional outfits, add-on fees do apply.
- Please be dressed in your first outfit upon arrival (preferably whatever is more casual).
- Props - i.e. instrument, sport equipment and/or uniform, pet, car, fashion accessories, etc.
- Mirror, hair and make-up tools for “touching up” and a towel to wipe your face if it is hot
- Anything else you need to be comfortable outside - i.e. bug spray, sunscreen, water, etc.

TIPS FOR YOUR GRADUATE

1. Choose clothing that matches your style and do not buy a new item that you will never wear again. This is your moment! Be your unique self.
2. Think through your entire outfit. Bring the right shoes, socks, undergarments and accessories. I will not Photoshop (edit) something that you have control of.
3. No new haircuts! If you plan to have a trim, do it at least one week before our session so you don't have that “I just got my haircut” look.
4. Choose the right photographer! Make sure that you have looked at my galleries (not just the seniors) to get an overall sense of my style. I want to make sure that our “vision” is well matched and that expectations are set well in advance of our shoot. Send me ideas and questions so we can chat and make your images the best they can be.
5. Do not rush! Plan ahead so that you can be on time (or early). It's great if we start out relaxed and fresh so get some quality sleep the night before.
6. Don't force your smile. We can work together so that you and your smile arrive naturally and organically. (serious or silly expressions are great too)
