- III. In one short sentence, what is Paul's argument to the Philippian Christians in **Phil. 2:13–18**?
- IV. What aspect of the gospel of Jesus Christ is in view in this text? How does/do the gospel connection(s) help us to better understand this week's text?
- V. **In one short sentence**, what argument do you think the Holy Spirit is making for us here at RBC from **Phil. 2:19–30**? How is this same and/or different from guestion III above?
- VI. Turn the points of application into a prayer for change. What specific goals for growth/change should you prayerfully pursue? Please also pray for Pastor Kitchen in his preparation to preach this text.
