The early Christians never felt abandoned by Christ, the Lord. The Church has always been and is the presence of Christ in the world and her members have become the voice, hands, feet and heart of the one who surrendered his life to rescue us from the darkness of death to lead us into the light of eternity. This theme resounds in today's readings, especially in the Gospel. In Christ, we discover the way that leads us to the Holy Spirit, the comforter, who showers us with the strength we need and the truth to set us free, liberating those who suffer from evil. Once again, in the second reading, Saint Peter offers us a clear exhortation about the lifestyle that must characterize a life of faith, always rooted in charity and service, full of hope that never fades.

Una vez más, en la segunda lectura, san Pedro nos ofrece una clara exhortación sobre el estilo de vida que debe caracterizar una vida de fe, siempre arraigada en la caridad y el servicio, llena de una esperanza que nunca se apaga.

### Kyrie Eleison

This prayer is still frequently prayed in Greek. It originated in Greek Liturgies and became part of the Latin Rite in the fifth century.

It is essentially a response to a litany. The Trinitarian interpretation (Lord...Christ...Lord) was a later development. Until 1969 each line was prayed or sung three times; after 1969 each line was sung or prayed (by a leader or choir) and then repeated (by assembly). While the prayer can be included in the Penitential Act, since it implores the Lord's mercy, it is above all a prayer of praise to the Risen Christ in Litany form.

### Confiteor ("I Confess")

Mea Culpa, "through my fault" (or "It's my fault"), is a phrase in any Confiteor, particularly the one sometimes used during the Penitential Act of the Mass. (Maxima culpa is "grievous" fault from the Latin maxima meaning "greatest" ---in this case "most serious.")

### Glory to God in the Highest

(Latin, Gloria in excelsis Deo)  
This is the Greater Doxology (Greek, doxa, "glory"), the lesser being the "Glory to the Father" or "Glory to God" prayer, also known as the "Glory Be". The Greater Doxology is the familiar "Gloria", spoken in unison or sung at Mass. Because it echoes the song of the angels at Bethlehem (See Luke 2:14), it is called the "Angelic Hymn."

### Kyrie Eleison

Esta oración aún se reza con frecuencia en griego. Se originó en las liturgias griegas y pasó a formar parte del rito latino en el siglo V. Es, en esencia, una respuesta a una letanía. La interpretación trinitaria (Señor... Cristo... Señor) se desarrolló posteriormente. Hasta 1969, cada invocación se rezaba o cantaba tres veces; después de 1969, cada invocación es cantada o rezada (por un guía o el coro) y luego repetida por la asamblea.

Aunque la oración puede incluirse en el acto penitencial, ya que implora la misericordia del Señor, es sobre todo una oración de alabanza a Cristo resucitado en forma de letanía.

### Confiteor (“Yo confieso”)

“Mea culpa” (“por mi culpa” o “es mi culpa”) es una expresión propia del Confiteor, especialmente en la forma que a veces se utiliza durante el Acto Penitencial de la Misa. “Maxima culpa” significa “culpa gravísima”, ya que proviene del latín máxima, que significa “la mayor” o “la más grande”, es decir, la más seria.

### Gloria a Dios en el cielo (latín: Gloria in excelsis Deo)

Esta es la Doxología Mayor (del griego doxa, “gloria”); la menor es el “Gloria al Padre”, también conocido como el “Gloria”. La Doxología Mayor es el conocido “Gloria”, que se recita en común o se canta en la Misa. Debido a que hace eco del canto de los ángeles en Belén (véase Lucas 2:14), se le llama el “Himno Angélico”.
