



Spiritual Morsels

("If the world is against truth, then I am against the world!" St Athanasius the Great)

You ask, will the heterodox be saved... Why do you worry about them? They have a Saviour Who desires the salvation of every human being. He will take care of them. You and I should not be burdened with such a concern. Study yourself and your own sins... **St. Theophan the Recluse**

Do not think about or do anything without a spiritual purpose, whereby it is done for God. For If you travel without purpose, you shall labor in vain. **St. Mark the Ascetic**

When God wants to have mercy on someone, He inspires someone else to pray for him, and He helps in this prayer. St. Silouan the Athonite

The Holy Apostle John the Theologian says that the commandments of God are not difficult, but easy (I John, 5:3). But they are only easy because of love, while they are all difficult if there is no love. **St. Silouan the Athonite**
