





Spiritual Morsels

The holy fathers in general consider blasphemous thoughts to be not our thoughts but provocations of the enemy; and when we do not agree with them but grieve that they have penetrated our mind, then this is a sign that we are not guilty of them. One should not be disturbed that they come. When a person becomes disturbed, the enemy attacks him even more, but when he pays no attention, disregards them and does not consider them to be a sin, then the thoughts vanish. **St Macarius**

"Certain people do themselves a great injustice, and therefore suffer needlessly at this stage, because they believe that God does not want them, that He does not forgive them, and that He reacts negatively toward them. No, far from it! God waits for each person, in the same way as the father in the Parable. Naturally, this is a parable; and the Lord sets the father in the place of God the Father. God waits for the time when you will return."

"The only important thing is for you to return, and to return with a repentant and contrite heart. This is what God awaits. Do not return, only with sentiments of audacity, presumption and boldness. Do not return with complaints and excuses. Return: with repentance, devoid of self-justification; being critical of yourself, in full; wholly humbled, and believing yourself to be unworthy of all things."

"The father is waiting, and he accepts the son who returns. If you allow me to say so, one is utterly taken back by the father's stance. It is as if nothing happened — as if he remembers nothing, as if the father knows nothing. He waits for his son, in order to again give him from the things he has lost. He does this, precisely because his child was on the verge of obliteration. As he says: 'He was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found' [Luke 15:24]. He believed him to be dead, as if he were lost. The only thing the father wanted was for his son to return."

"On the other hand, we have the heavenly Father; and on the other hand, we have each person who - let us pay close attention to this - is free, a rational being. God expects from humans, as free and rational beings, to think and act responsibly. Did you fall? Did you get negatively influenced? Did you distance yourself? Did you sin? Did you get lost? Return. Come to yourself and return home. If, however, you are someone who constantly circles around God and never distances yourself from Him, but you do not love Him, do not expect God to act."
