Dishonor is medicine for a self-centered soul. Abba Zosimas

...NIGHT POSSESSED US AND THE SHADOW OF DEATH ENCOMPASSED US, FOR WE HAD FALLEN INTO SIN AND LOST THE POWER OF SIGHT WHICH WAS OURS BY GOD'S GRACE AND BY WHICH WE WERE ABLE TO PERCEIVE THE LIGHT THAT BESTOWS TRUE LIFE. NIGHT AND DEATH HAD BEEN POURED OUT ON OUR HUMAN NATURE, NOT BECAUSE OF ANY CHANGE IN THE TRUE LIGHT, BUT BECAUSE WE HAD TURNED ASIDE AND NO LONGER HAD ANY INCLINATION TOWARDS THE LIFE-BEARING LIGHT. IN THE LAST TIMES, HOWEVER, THE GIVER OF ETERNAL LIGHT AND SOURCE OF TRUE LIFE HAS HAD MERCY UPON US.

ST. GREGORY PALAMAS

When **Saint Sisoes** lay upon his deathbed, the disciples surrounding the Elder saw that his face shone like the sun. They asked the dying man what he saw. Abba Sisoes replied that he saw Saint Anthony, the prophets, and the apostles. His face increased in brightness, and he spoke with someone. The monks asked, "With whom are you speaking, Father?" He said that angels had come for his soul, and he was entreating them to give him a little more time for repentance. The monks said, "You have no need for repentance, Father." Saint Sisoes said with great humility, "I do not think that I have even begun to repent." After these words the face of the holy abba shone so brightly that the brethren were not able to look upon him. Saint Sisoes told them that he saw the Lord Himself. Then there was a flash like lightning, and a fragrant odor, and Abba Sisoes departed to the Heavenly Kingdom. Sayings of the Desert Fathers

"It is true, unfortunately, that there is so much filth in this world that no matter what path the soul - which desires purity - may follow, it will get soiled. The difference is that God will not make the same demands on a Christian, who wishes to remain pure today, that He made in the past. Purity requires nerves of steel; a young man must try every means to resist temptation, and he will surely have God's help. When divine eros is kindled in his heart, the burning is such that every other desire and unseemly picture will be burned out. When this divine fire is burning within us, we experience pleasures so divine that all other pleasures pale in comparison. When we taste the heavenly manna, wild carobs will mean nothing to us. This is why we should hold fast to the steering wheel [the Gospel teachings, expressed through the Patristic Fronema (mind-set) of the Faith], make the sign of the Cross and not be afraid. After every little struggle, heavenly delights follow. If we are brave when temptation comes, God and Panaghia will help miraculously."

"The Elder Augustinos told me the following story: When he was a young novice, he lived in a Monastery in his native Russia. Most of the Fathers there were old, and so they would use him for various chores — such as helping a monastery employee with fishing, the Monastery's main means of support. One day, the daughter of that employee came and asked her father to return home, for an emergency, and she stayed to help in his place. But the poor girl was seized by temptation, and came on the novice with sinful intentions — without thinking. Antonios, this was his name when he was in the world, was taken aback, because everything happened so suddenly. He crossed himself and said: 'My Christ, I'd rather drown than sin!' and plunged himself into the sea. But the good Lord, seeing the heroism of this young man, ... [desiring] to remain chaste, kept him afloat and completely dry! 'You see,' he explained to me, I jumped - head first - into the river, and I still cannot figure out how I found myself standing up — with my clothes dry!' At that moment, he felt an internal peace and inexpressible sweetness, which made every sinful thought and carnal desire, caused by the indecent gestures of the young woman, go away. When she saw Antonios standing up on the water, she was overcome by repentance; and started weeping — deeply moved by this great miracle."
