

"When you have difficulty saying the Prayer, you should chant softly. Psalmody is prayer too. Psalmody imparts a kind of gentleness to the heart; it sweetens it and warms it with spiritual calories. Thus, psalmody creates the best prerequisites for one to say the Prayer earnestly. For me, the right buttons to push for the spiritual life are these: a short but intense study, the Jesus Prayer, prostrations and Psalmody... Psalmody is contempt for the devil."

"The Church is suffering today, because divine illumination is missing; and each person understands things as he wishes. The human element gets involved, passions are aroused, and the devil comes in and roams all over. This is why people that are governed by their passions should not seek to govern."

deathtotheworld It was said concerning Abba Agathon that some monks came to find him having heard tell of his great discernment. Wanting to see if he would lose his temper they said to him 'Aren't you that Agathon who is said to be a fornicator and a proud man?' 'Yes, it is very true,' he answered. They resumed, 'Aren't you that Agathon who is always talking nonsense?' 'I am.' Again they said 'Aren't you Agathon the heretic?' But at that he replied 'I am not a heretic.' So they asked him, 'Tell us why you accepted everything we cast you, but repudiated this last insult.' He replied 'The first accusations I take to myself for that is good for my soul. But heresy is separation from God. Now I have no wish to be separated from God.' At this saying they were astonished at his discernment and returned, edified.

The old men said to Abba Agathon to Abba Elias, in Egypt, 'He is a good Abba.' The old man answered them, 'In comparison with his own generation, he is good.' They said to him, 'And what is he in comparison with the ancients?' He gave them this answer, 'I have said to you that in comparison with his generation he is good but as to that of the ancients, in Scetis I have seen a man who, like Joshua the son of Nun could make the sun stand still in the heavens.' At these words they were astounded and gave glory to God.

Abba Agathon said, "I consider no other labor as difficult as prayer. When we are ready to pray, our spiritual enemies interfere. They understand it is only by making it difficult for us to pray that they can harm us. Other things will meet with success if we keep at it, but laboring at prayer is a war that will continue until we die." less
