I. R.G. LeTourneau (1888-1969), a Christian man with little education, was one of our nation's greatest inventors with 300 patents in earthmoving and other heavy equipment. He and his plants produced 70% of the heavy earthmoving machines used by the Allies during World War II. What was his rule for success? He gave 90% of all income back to the Lord. His favorite verse was Matthew 6:33. His philosophy and experience about giving was, "I shovel out the money, and God shovels it back to me-but God has a bigger shovel." He said, "It's not how much money I give to God, but rather how much of God's money do I keep for myself."

With the help of his wife, the late Evelyn Peterson (1900-1987), he founded LeTourneau University, a private, Christian institution, in Longview, Texas. LeTourneau was widely known as a devoted Christian and philanthropist to Christian causes, including the "LeTourneau Christian Center" camp and conference grounds in Rushville, New York and Georgia Baptist Conference Center in Toccoa, Georgia. LeTourneau was often referred to by his contemporaries as "God's businessman." ¹ *Wikipedia*

- IV. How you give counts more that how much you give.
 - A. (2 Cor. 8:12 For if there be first a willing mind, it is accepted according to that a man hath, and not according to that he hath not.)
 - B. (2 Cor. 9:7 Every man according as he purposeth in his heart, so let him give; not grudgingly, or of necessity: for God loveth a cheerful giver.)
- V. Open a debit and credit account. (Philippians 4:15-19)
