Message from the SDCWGA President



The 2025 season is in full swing as we dodge the muchneeded raindrops. SDCWGA has over 900 registered members with active GHINs, by far the largest women's golf membership list in the county.

Susan Crawford As a result of the popularity of many of our events this year, we have changed the event registration process to include a random drawing to accept teams/players if the event is oversubscribed within the 1st 48 hours of open registration. We initiated this process for the Roam from Home and within the 48 hours we were oversubscribed by 8 players. Fortunately, we were able to go back to the course and add 2 tee times, so all players were accepted into the event.

We experienced slow play at The Golf Club of California in February; the event was a shotgun start. The group that teed off from hole #1 finished their round in just over 4 hours. Due to slow play later in the field, the back of the field finished their rounds in just over 5 hours. One hole had 5 foursomes playing or waiting on the tee box. To improve pace of play in future events, each event will have a SDCWGA marshal on the course to assist in keeping play moving.

RULES CORNER by Sandra Watkins

TEST YOUR GOLF KNOWLEDGE

(Selected questions from a Golf Digest Rules Quiz)

- 1. Your ball is playable in a penalty area, but you're not sure how the vegetation will affect your swing. Can you stand in the penalty area, several yards from your ball, and make "test swings" through the vegetation to get a feel for the shot?
- 2. Your opponent in a match hits an approach shot that appears to be blown off course by the wind. Can you ask your opponent what direction the wind was coming from?
- 3. Facing an unnerving situation around the green, you accidentally hit your ball twice with the same abrupt swing. Does this count as one stroke or two?
- 4. Your ball is in bounds, but barely, and you can't hit it unless you stand out of bounds on the other side of a fence that borders the course. Can you do that?
- 5. You mark your ball on the putting green, replace it, then a gust of wind moves it closer to the hole. Where do you play your next stroke from—the new location or the old location?

Answers to the Golf Digest Rules Quiz

- 1. So long as you don't improve the condition for your next stroke, you can hack away.
- 2. Yes, you can ask about wind direction, distances to objects, even locations of things on the course. <u>Advice: Definitions.</u>
- 3. It's one stroke. Lucky you, this rule was changed in 2019. It used to be that it counted as a stroke, plus an additional one-stroke penalty. $\underline{\text{Rule 10.1a}}$
- 4. You sure can. If it was a chain-link fence, you can even hit the fence instead of the ball to get out of trouble. Rule 18.2a
- 5. Once you mark your ball on a putting green and it moves, you have to replace it. $\underline{\text{Rule}}$ $\underline{\textbf{13.1d}}$
